(maximum 1500 characters) *	<p>*United Nations established the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UNOCHA) to mobilize and coordinate effective and principled humanitarian action in partnership with national and international actors in order to alleviate human suffering in natural disasters and emergencies, promote preparedness and prevention efforts to reduce future vulnerability, facilitate sustainable solutions by addressing root causes and advocate for the rights of people. . UNOCHA receives funds from donors, for which it is accountable, and allocates these funds to International Non-Governmental Organizations and the UN agencies who will be able to implement directly or through local NGO partners to support humanitarian activities. The Common Humanitarian Fund for Somalia (CHF) is administered by OCHA. The objective of the fund is to strategically fund assessed humanitarian action in Somalia and improve timeliness as well as coherence of humanitarian response. The fund also supports priority clusters and regional priorities in accordance with identified needs. CHF Somalia has developed an accountability framework based on 4 pillars: Reporting, Monitoring, NGO Capacity Assessment and Projects Audit. According to this framework approved by the CHF board in December 2012, a pilot phase will be implemented to test the recommended monitoring tools on 40 projects.*</p>

(maximum 1500 characters) *	<p>Since 2010, CHF has funded 436 projects and more than 75 in 2012. The implementation phase of the accountability framework on the programmatic monitoring pillar has identified 4 monitoring methods applicable to the Somalia context : fields visits including third party monitoring, remote monitoring, call center, SMS and satellite image. The output of this project will be monitored by the CHF Monitoring Working Group. OCHA is therefore seeking UNOPs services in selecting contractors that would comply with the TOR of the CHF Monitoring activities pf this pilot phase.</p>
<b>(C)</b> List and describe the activities that your organization is currently implementing to address these needs.(maximum 1500 characters)	<p>Under the overall supervision of OCHA/CHF and in close collaboration with CHF partners, the 4 contractors will conduct monitoring activities of 40 projects among the many implemented the first allocation 2012 (35), 1 ER project and 4 projects from the second allocation 2012. The breakdown per cluster is EDU:1; FS: 8; Health: 8; NFI/Shelter: 4; NUT:5; Protection: 2; WASH: 12. The breakdown per region is Lower Juba: 13; Banadir: 15; Middle Shabelle: 10; Bakool:3. A detailed list of projects to be monitored will be provided by the CHF secretariat to the contractors. The objective of this project is to test the Third party and call center activities. We will be able to evaluate the best combination of monitoring tools that will give us the best confidence of achievement at the field level. 37 projects will be monitored using a third party monitoring in 3 different regions with 3 different contractors. 24 projects will be monitored using call campaign activities with one contractor.</p>
