3. BACKGROUND AND NEEDS ANALYSIS (please adjust row size as needed)

(maximum 1500 characters) *	<p>The expectation of favorable Gu rains in 2013, coupled with difficult living conditions for IDPs across Somalia have resulted in an increased level of interest for return by the IDP populations in Mogadishu, Puntland and Somaliland. Groups of IDPs (mostly recently displaced) approached humanitarian actors to seek support to return back to their villages of origin (VoO). Without proper management, logistic and financial support, the sustainability of the returns is very limited, with the consequence of exposing vulnerable individuals to protection risks and to encourage further displacement in the short term.</p> <p>FAO and UNHCR are part of the Return Consortium (RC), a hub of different expertise from relevant UN agencies and International NGOs committed to ensure a multi-sectoral approach in the implementation of the IDP voluntary return programme. Return Consortium members have facilitated the return of around 1,700 families in the last few months with RC approved support package, and results up to date are encouraging. In 2012 and early 2013 UNHCR and FAO have already experienced a partnership implementing an IDP voluntary Return programme in Somalia in partnership with other RC members. RC members are also involved in the Mogadishu Task Force on Voluntary Return, aiming at coordinating and facilitating the implementation arrangements at field level and to respond to critical needs related to return.</p>

(maximum 1500 characters) *	<p>Information from intention surveys conducted by the Return Consortium indicate that around 16,000 households are willing to return to their homes in various parts of central south Somalia (particularly to Bay and Lower Shabelle regions) during 2013. The majority of IDPs are currently living in unplanned settlements with little access to livelihoods and basic services. There is an urgent need to facilitate their return and to provide the returnees with basic support to restart their livelihoods. FAO under this project propose to support 400 IDP returnees HHs (2,400 individuals) in Baidoa district of Bay region and Walna Weyn District in Lower Shabele Region. Standard assistance packages (based on needs of different livelihoods groups) and operating procedures (SoPs), in accordance with the relevant international frameworks have been agreed among the Return Consortium members. Joint planning, advocacy and linkages with existing coordination mechanisms are considered crucial to make returns sustainable.</p>

(maximum 1500 characters)	<p>UNHCR and FAO have already implemented IDP voluntary return in 2012 through partners targeting around 2,000 HHs, who successfully returned from Mogadishu and Garowe to their homes in Bay and Lower Shabelle regions. Both organizations also targeted 2,636 IDP returnees in the same regions for Gu 2013 season. FAO has been supporting IDP returns for 18 months with needs-based integrated and livelihood support. For example, agro-pastoral IDPs returning home received improved agricultural inputs (seeds and fertilizers) sufficient for 2 hectares cultivation, cash for work opportunities for 5 months to rehabilitate productive infrastructure and a small set of livestock (treated and vaccinated sheep/goats).</p> <p>FAO's assistance package is intended to kick start crop production, create work opportunities for income generation and create asset base in line with FAO's Resilience Programme (2013-15) to further enhance the resilience of IDP returnees. Furthermore, both UNHCR and FAO count on an extensive network of staff and field offices which represent an added value. Their respective expertise in Protection and Livelihood in Somalia is considered a key for the whole Return Consortium. The pilot implementation in 2012 has been a significant test, and it contributed to define more accurate internal procedures and to identify emerging needs. Finally UNHCR and FAO have experience in extensive return operation in other countries for both IDP and refugee.</p>
