**OUTCOME 2: An effective policy and legal frame-work from national level to the grassroots for improved nutrition governance by 2014 to support the scale-up of proven interventions in country**

- Inaugural training in nutrition advocacy initiated in August 2013. The five day (19-23 August 2013) training targeted 30 youths from various CSOs. .
- UCCO-SUN supported Ministry of Health to host a public symposium on 2<sup>nd</sup> August, 2013 at Kyambogo University. The symposium was conducted during the World Breast Feeding Week under the theme “*Strengthening community support for optimal breastfeeding towards a healthy, well-nourished and HIV free generation*”
- Participated in the development of the Uganda Nutrition Advocacy Strategy and Plan. The plan is awaiting approval from the Nutrition Secretariat , Office of the Prime Minister

UCCO-SUN hosted two policy dialogues held to support nutrition advocacy initiatives

- Dialogue targeting 20 parliamentarians and other CSO representatives during the Global Week of Action on Nutrition held at Imperial Royale Hotel, Kampala, Uganda held on 6th June, 2013. The theme for the dialogue was "# Food 4 All"

Dialogue targeting 150 representatives of parliament, Ministry of Health Senior and technical leadership (Ministers, Commissioners and Principals); representatives of UN, development agencies and CSOs. The dialogue was held to launch the World Breastfeeding Week (WBW) under the theme “*Strengthening community support for optimal breastfeeding towards a healthy, well-nourished and HIV free generation*”. The Minister of Health Hon. Dr. Ruhakana Rugunda presided over the dialogue and the Deputy Speaker of Parliament, Hon. Jacob Olanyo was the guest of Honor. The dialogue was aimed at garnering efforts by the general public to practice, promote and protect optimal breastfeeding practices.

**OUTCOME 3: A stronger and sustainable multi-stakeholder dialogue from national level to the grassroots for better government accountability on nutrition investments by 2014**

- National level media dialogue held on 5<sup>th</sup> June, 2013 at Hotel Triangle, Kampala, Uganda. Dialogue was held as part of UCCOSUN's target to raise media knowledge on nutrition issues and to initiate media involvement in campaigns around the Global Week of Nutrition Action in June. This coincided with the Hunger Summit in the UK on June 8th and the International CSO Conference in Washington on 10th June 2013 to probe for more funding for nutrition interventions
- Regional media dialogue held in Mbarara on 6<sup>th</sup> August to engage regional journalists in reporting on breastfeeding during the WBW
- Engaged school children of Kitante Primary School, Kampala and Kisimbiri Primary School, Wakiso district in a nutrition advocacy event tailored to raise political momentum during the Global Week of Action on nutrition in June 2013
- In commemoration of the WBW, nutrition and child health campaigns were held in Lira and Tororo districts to increase community involvement and appreciation of the nutrition interventions.
- Coalition members participated in the launch of the Partnership for HIV Free Survival (PHFS) program in Namutumba district, officiated by the Minister of State for Health aimed at mobilising the communities to “*strengthen community support for optimal breastfeeding towards a healthy, well-nourished and HIV free generation*”.
