3. BACKGROUND AND NEEDS ANALYSIS (please adjust row size as needed)

(maximum 1500 characters) *	<p>A humanitarian catastrophe is looming in Middle Shabelle. What has started as low scale floods in late April 2013 has turned to be one of the most devastating floods in the region in recent years. The Shabelle river overflowed its banks, causing huge displacement, loss of life and property in 33 villages across the region.</p> <p>As a recent multi-sector assessment revealed, these floods have directly affected at least 12,346 households (estimated 74, 076 individuals) most of them vulnerable women and children. More than 9,855 households (about 59,130 individuals) remain stranded in 23 villages isolated by the floods which can only be accessed via boat. Residents in 10 affected villages were forced to abandon their homes for safety and are now living in temporary shelters in Jowhar, Berimo, Shimbirow, Baraweyne and Kongo. At least 50 people have been confirmed dead as a direct result of floods. Around 5,100 homes were destroyed by the floods and 67 kilometers of land has sustained damage to crops. Floods have also destroyed a number of water sources that have contributed to water scarcity.</p> <p>Further complicating the humanitarian situation in Middle Shabelle is the eruption of inter-clan warfare that has resulted in the displacement of 3,000 households from 11 villages after their homes were burned by opposing clans. These IDPs are now scattered between Jowhar airport and Burane and remain in urgent need for life-saving support.</p>

(maximum 1500 characters) *	<p>In response to these crises, SYPD has participated in a multi-sector rapid assessment to study the scale of disaster and the living condition of those affected. Through this assessment SYPD has learnt that communities affected by floods and inter-clan war in the region are in urgent need for life-saving humanitarian support.</p> <p>The number of malnourished mothers and children is on the increase due to the lack of basic nutritious foods and other essential rations. Access to water is limited as floods have destroyed a number of water sources in affected villages. At least 65 shallow wells, 15 berkads and 13 water kiosks are not working. The assessment team has witnessed people drinking contaminated water in fields nearby. Likewise, people lack access to food since floods have swept their crop productions including those stored underground. Due to the lack of latrines, IDPs use open defecation which has resulted in alarmingly poor hygiene levels in visited settlements. The eruption of hygiene-related diseases in the region is imminent. Besides, IDPs live in makeshift shelters that expose vulnerable households members such as children to hypothermia. Lack of adequate shelter is also exposing IDPs girls to sexual and gender based violence.</p> <p>Huge gap exists in meeting the needs above. Due to the lack of funding, response to this humanitarian emergency remains very limited. Hence, SYPD is submitting this proposal to fill the gap and prevent a looming humanitarian disaster.</p>
(C) List and describe the activities that your organization is currently implementing to address these needs.(maximum 1500 characters)	<p>Recently, SYPD has donated \$1,000 dollars in cash in response to a fundraising effort undertaken by the Somali government. In partnership with Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC), SYPD is planning to distribute 5,000 NFI kits to improve shelter conditions for flood-affected communities in Middle Shabelle. Moreover, SYPD plans to coordinate with ICRC to provide clean water for affected IDP in the region.</p> <p>Throughout project implementation, SYPD will coordinate with agencies active in Middle Shabelle such as OIC, ICRC, Qatar Charity, WOCCA and others to reach the largest number of people possible and to prevent an overlap in activities.</p>
