The initial budget forecast for this budget line has been changed to another means of transport using air transport rather than a barge which would have carried all the bulky supplies in one trip. The budget shall be reduced to two flights of 5,880 each. (- USD 240)

3.2 Travel (Juba - Ayod)

Following fighting that was reported in Ayod on 27th and 28th April, the community of Ayod fled and disbanded the area, leaving the town destroyed and COSV base possibly not spared (to be verified). COSV plans to shift its operation base to Jiech where the new County Health Coordination office shall be based. Hence travel to Ayod shall be diverted to Jiech. (- USD 400)
