<p>To build and ensure civil society capacity in policy engagement, policy analysis and lobbying</p>	<p>. Following the process of the draft document with pos-2015 agenda and objectives, 3 working meetings were done with SETSAN, MoH-Nutrition Dto, and REACH, to get a consensus as a final document to be submitted by SETSAN to Ministry of Plan and Development (MPD). The same objectives and target goals are going to be used/proposed by SETSAN to the next Government 5 years plan (PQG).</p> <p>. At Inhambane Province the CS network was invited by provincial SETSAN to participate on PAMRDC presentation session to the Governor, as a SETSAN working group member</p> <p>. Still in Inhambane, the CS network organize a group working meet to analyse the provincial PAMRDC and prepare a summary with the main activities by target group, to allow the member to align their own plans/projects</p> <p>. Nampula province is now in the process of developing the provincial PAMRDC, and the CS network is involved on the process.</p>	
<p>To monitor operationalization, funding and implementation of PAMRDC and other national and regional strategies and plans on nutrition</p>	<p>. In Tete, CS network was invited by provincial SETSAN to be part of the PAMRDC supervisor and monitoring team.</p> <p>. Some members of the CS network in Tete, had also participated on the provincial observatory (a governmental monitoring process for the implementation of the annual social and economic plans)</p> <p>. Visit trips to the 3 CS provincial networks, to check the implementation of their own plans and give support needed to continue with their work.</p> <p>. Participation on the global SUN evaluation (Mozambique was selected as one of the 8 countries for a country study)</p> <p>. During this period, continued to participate in different national level meetings, namely, Nutrition Partners Forum (development partners technical working group), and the technical working group for the national nutrition plan for the reduction of chronic undernutrition (GT-PAMRDC) hosted by the Secretariat for Food Security and Nutrition (SETSAN);</p>	

<p>To advocate for greater attention to nutrition in public, private and non-profit interventions</p>	<p>.Participation on the civil society platform for social protection meeting with representatives of different political parties. The event aimed to advocate for the inclusion of social protection (including nutrition) on parties manifest. ROSC, one of the SUN CS platform is also a member of the social protection platform.</p> <p>. Participation on the CSAN working group (a group headed by SETSAN and created to work on Advocacy e Communication strategy for PAMRDC); the work, ended with a definition of key messages, by sector, to be used to advocate among decision makers and those who influence them.</p> <p>. HKI, one of the CS members, had convened a meeting with journalist and schools/university for journalism, to advocate for their major involvement on Nutrition issue. Qualitative achievements against outcomes and results:

- As a result of the contacts between MASC (a support mechanism for CS for good governance) and ANSA (as the coordinator for CS SUN), in the 3 provinces where we established CS networks, some of the members sign contracts with MASC for a Mapping exercise of all existing civil group in all the districts of those 3 provinces. The objective is to create CS groups at district level to also work on nutrition issue. This is under an agreement sign between DANIDA and MASC.
