- 1. Discussions and implementation plans have been underway on engagement and approach/s in the implementation of component 2 of the project. A template of the verification form has been established taking into account the feasible activities pertaining to the livelihood and skills of target survivors.
- 2. Attempts are made to harmonize and synergies activities of Pink Cross Sierra Leone a local Non-Government Organization, UNWEMEN and UNDP.
- 3. Programme manager of the joint- project met on Wednesday, 7<sup>th</sup> October to liaise and engagement on what both organizations have so far done in past month of the project. Experience were shared and as well mapping the way forward to

kick-start implementation of livelihood activities.

- 4. UN Women engaged community organizations (Four CSOs that are closely working with the survivors in Bombali, Kambia, Port Loko, Kenema and Kailahun) to design appropriate livelihood initiatives together with the beneficiaries. They all agreed to come back with deliverables on;
  - Livelihood programme design that carries value addition and entrepreneurship skills
  - One assessment report on analysis of livelihood options taking into consideration diversity of capacity, livelihood assets
    and needs covering the following: viable trades for the area; identifying skills through capacity building for beneficiaries;
    identifying the existing support services in the locality (e.g., agriculture extension service; livestock support services etc for
    eventual partnership building at a later stage)
  - Updated list of beneficiaries by livelihood options for each district.
  - A training manual based on the identified skills trainings including entrepreneurship skills for enhancement of rural livelihood for women; trainers availability and quality assurance; schedule of trainings and duration; number of participants per session
  - Clear elaboration of current socio-economic status of survivors and destitute families that gives opportunity to identify changes in status during and after implementation.
  - Implementation approach that demonstrate Community consultations to identify priorities/opportunities for a sustainable rural livelihood interventions particularly for female EVD survivor and destitute families.

- 1. Finalization of a comprehensive list of survivors and destitute families to serve for cash transfer: UNDP and UN WOMEN have identified their respective targets and their respective areas of intervention.
- 2. The hiring process for the consultants for livelihood assessment and development plans is under finalization.
- 3. Draft mapping of livelihood options and workable concepts on livelihood intervention for various survivors and destitute families by Community Organization and NGOs.
- 4. Pink Cross has launched the psycho-social counselling and hygiene and sanitation support for 250 Ebola survivors in Freetown.
- 5. Pink Cross complete it maiden registration and mapping of 131 Ebola Survivors with 65 female, 66 males, and 18 children and 2 orphans at the Aberdeen Community in the Western Rural of capital Freetown.
- 6. Commencement of the psychosocial support is presently on-going in the Western Area with data from 32 families so far captured.
- 7. Kick-start psychosocial trauma healing, hygiene and sanitation training workshop was successfully conducted for over 2000 Ebola survivor and the Aberdeen community center on August 28<sup>th</sup> 2015.
- 8. Completion of one- day intense training workshop for 40 community volunteers on mental health, stress management cancelling, and psychosocial support was successfully conducted on 3<sup>rd</sup> September at the Pink Cross Head office at juba in Freetown.
- 9. Field implementation of the house-to- house visitation by Ebola survivors and community stakeholder launched on Wednesday 9 2015, with key messages on hygiene, sanitation and psychosocial cancelling and trauma and healing to Ebola survivors, victims and the destitute.

Hiring of livelihood consultants: Some challenges in the procurement are resulting in delays in hiring the consultants. But

mitigation measures are being taken by the Senior management.

Securing a consolidated and agreed upon national list of survivors is a greater challenge. The Government of SL and UN agencies have formed a Steering Committee. A government and international community joint efforts are going on to register and verify the Survivors. The initiative has started in Freetown Western Area on the 5<sup>th</sup> of October.
