

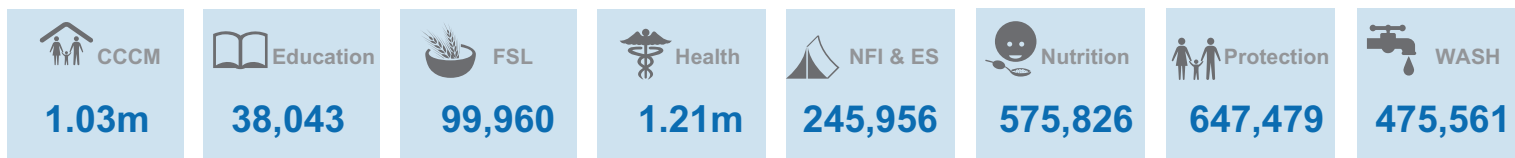
CHF ALLOCATES \$2.4 MILLION TO SAVE LIVES IN UNITY STATE

In November 2015, the CHF allotted US\$2.4 million through its fourth reserve allocation for 2015 to provide life-saving assistance in southern Unity State, where humanitarian needs are dire, following months of fighting. The funds are being used in Nyal, Ganyiel and Mayendit to re-establish basic emergency health care services, treat acutely malnourished children, improve water sources including boreholes and hand pumps, enable mine clearance and establish temporary learning spaces, among other activities.

New funding received

In November, new contributions of \$7.6 and \$1 million from the United Kingdom and Switzerland respectively were received. Additional commitments of \$4.9 and 2.7 million were made by Australia and Norway in November respectively. However, despite donors' generous support to the CHF, funding levels remain significantly below last year, with \$85.1 million received to date in 2015 compared to \$117.9 million received by the same time in 2014 amounting to a decrease of 28%. Efforts are ongoing to mobilise urgently needed funding to support life-saving humanitarian action in South Sudan for the remainder of 2015 and the first quarter of 2016.

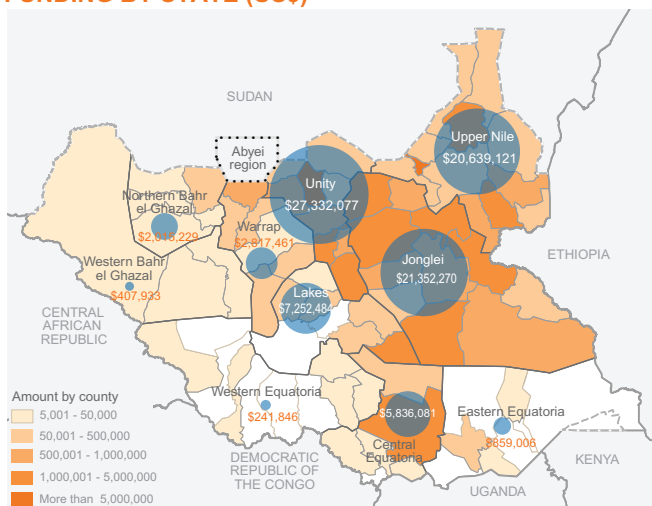
PEOPLE REACHED WITH CHF-FUNDED PROJECTS IN 2015



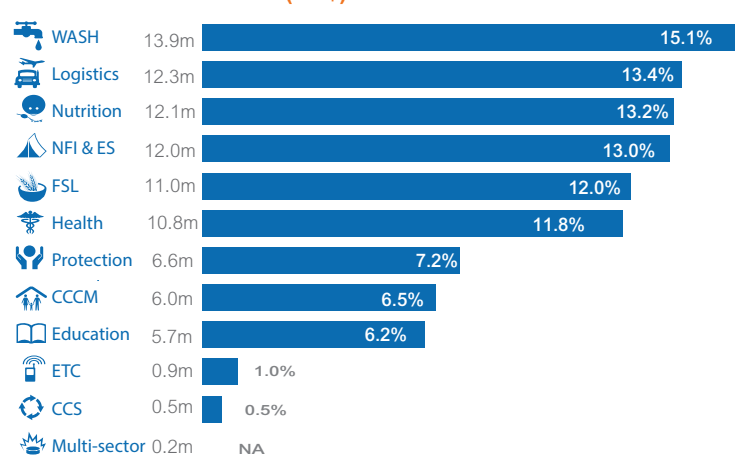

FUND DISTRIBUTION

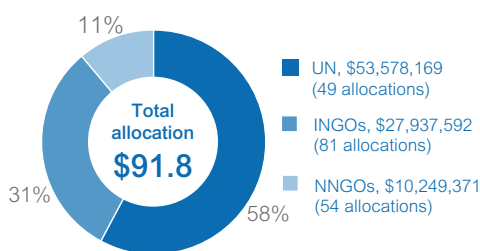
FUNDING BY STATE (US\$)



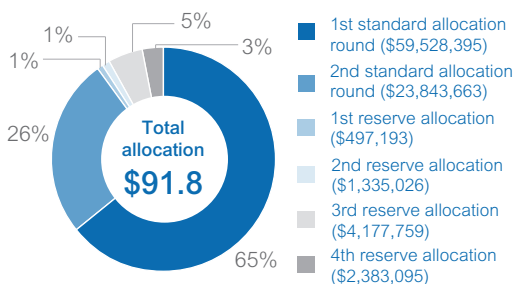
FUNDING BY CLUSTER (US\$)



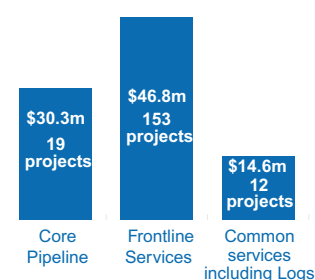
FUNDING BY AGENCY TYPE



FUNDING BY ALLOCATION TYPE

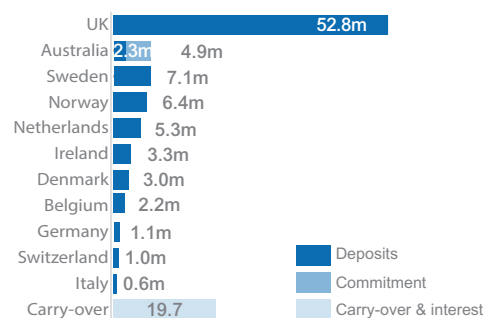


FUNDING BY PROJECT TYPE
