PLANNED RESPONSE

The project interventions will strengthen community level peacebuilding initiatives and foster greater social cohesion by bringing together communities for peaceful dialogue and through specific activities targeted towards harmonious co-existence. The approach builds on the partner's field experience and knowledge of the existing triggers of conflicts in the North Darfur. The peace building interventions upscale the work in the 6 existing villages from previous DCPSF projects and utilize the lessons learnt to create CBRMs (Community Based Resolution Mechanisms) in 4 new villages.

Activities

Four new CBRMs will be established; The members of the committees, including women (30% where possible), will be selected and subsequently trained on peacebuilding, negotiation, conflict management and administrative laws. Peace building trainings will be facilitated by the peace centre of El Fasher University, which has the experience to support CBRMs. One of the major activities under this output would be the establishment of the CBRM network at El Fasher level.

Activities under this output will support Farmer Field Schools (FFS) and Pastoralist Field Schools (PFS) to encourage farmers and pastoralists to cooperate and to engage in constructive activities. 50 Field Schools opened (25 Farmer Field Schools (FFS) and 25 Pastoralist Field Schools(PFS) in 10 targeted villages.

The pastoralist villages of Guba and Toma, the project will facilitate the training and kits to 10 Community Animal Health Workers (CAHWs) and knowledge awareness of livestock management through the PFSs. CAHWs and PFSs will address observance of migratory routes and disputes settlement. The vaccination awareness raising campaigns will be organized for 20,000 heads of goats, sheep and camels.

Rehabilitation of 1 Haffir and four hand pumps, construction of 10 shallow wells, to enhance interaction between various communities and to reduce resource pressure. Joint planning and consultation between households of different tribes and between farmers and pastoralists will be part of these activities to enhance positive cooperation among communities.

A state level Peacebuilding Network will be established in El Fasher, which will incorporate all CBRMs active in North Darfur, and link them with other relevant partners such as Universities, Civil Society Organizations, LNGOs, INGOs, UN Agencies, Government Ministries and departments, HAC and security services. This will allow for greater interaction, dialogue and peacebuilding efforts not only at the village level, but on a larger State level, and with a wide range of diverse partners and institutions.

PLANNED RESPONSE

The project will aim to achieve a peaceful co-existence among the different tribes of Katila and Edd Elfursan localities that will foster re-settlement and recovery of conflict-affected communities in Darfur. The project intervention recognizes the tribal conflicts and the intra-tribal conflicts and works at all levels to prevent conflict; to address conflict when it arises; and, to foster ongoing peace building and reconciliation efforts. The project relies on traditionally accepted and tried-and-tested peace building and conflict resolution mechanisms. The project recognizes the significant role of women and youth (particularly demobilized youth without stable livelihoods) whose contribution to peace building and conflict resolution is enormous but often is neglected. This project will design interventions in spreading messages on peace while recognizing the role of the different power relationships and perceptions of masculinity in influencing the direction of conflict. The project will address both the root causes and triggers of conflict.

Activities

Establishing functional and effective community-level conflict resolution and prevention structures in 8 communities; Conduct peace conference between Gerner and Flata intra tribal conflicts. The project also supports communities to institute 'rakobas' (community meetings) in eight target villages.

Enhance access to shared assets as connectors for peace and cooperation between communities; Establishment of four (4) water systems and formulate joint water management committees; construction 12 class rooms and common meeting room and women and child friendly centres.

Establishment of natural resource management committees in Katila and Edd Elfursan; One migratory route demarcated through 8 villages; Construction of market shades and designating joint market days between communities.

This project will link community-level conflict resolution structures to State level institutions and the Darfur wide agendas. Dissemination of information on progress of peace building efforts at national and State levels; One Capacity building initiative designed for of local partner.
