PLANNED RESPONSE

The project will work in Hilal, Ardeb, Harrar, Agabullah and their neighbouring settlements in Abu Karinka locality, Adilla, Abu Jabra, El Garadai settlements and their surrounding communities in Adila locality, in Sheq Al Takla, Abu Jabra and Al Huda communities in Abu Jabra locality. Conflict mapping indicates that these communities witness constant fights over natural resources (water, land), economic presence (trading, owning local shops) between two main tribes the Rezzigat (mainly pastoralist) and Maliya (mainly agriculturalist) and their alliances causes great division by fear, mistrust and constant fighting triggers with political insecurity, presence of IDPs and South Sudanese refugees, presence of weapons, armed groups (link with North Darfuri opposition groups) and tribalism.

The root causes of the conflict e.g. imbalance economic power sharing, inadequate setting of land ownership, inadequate marking of migratory route, lacking water management system around water sources will be tackled.

Activities

- A detailed baseline assessment will be conducted to map the exact conflict in each community with a short film (baseline film) about the conflict dynamics in the region. This will be followed by awareness raising campaigns.
- 3 established or new CBRMs will be supported through training and linkages to project activities.
- **Indigenous culture** promoted through (e.g. inter & intra cultural events, sport, drama) focussed on youth
- 6 Income Generating Activities tailored to inter and intra community needs based on skills training, literacy and numeracy classes will increase inter and intra-tribal and community interactions
- Existing water sharing points (water yards, catchments, and haffirs) will be maintained and water management systems will be established and/or revitalized.
- Four Rural markets will be revitalized and used as key connectors between all stakeholders.
- 3 Peace centers/shelters will be established to enhance peace meetings, dispute solving, and social
 events,
- Demarcation and monitoring of 1 nomadic migration routes will be organized through community leaders
- There will a state-level peace conference organized with the participation of the peace committee members
- Sustainable peace roadmap will be prepared and linked with the State level peace process. GAH will be a mediator between all stakeholders to initiate this peace process.
