<b>PROBLEM STATEMENT</b>	<p>The gaps identified by IOM include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) The need for immediate action toward durable solutions in respect to address the needs and rights of the survivors and affected communities;</li> <li>b) The lack of awareness among the survivors of CRSV, the affected communities and the public about the right to access to adequate remedies and especially reparations;</li> <li>c) The lack of comprehensive mapping of the multitude of actors who are currently providing various types of assistance to the survivors, their capacities as well as the type of assistance being provided;</li> <li>d) The insufficient understanding about the scale, the models and the quality of the efforts to document the cases of CRSV violations;</li> <li>e) The need for improved capacity of the local NGOs and CSOs to advocate for reparations and assist the CRSV survivors in demanding and receiving reparations and other remedies;</li> <li>f) The lack of knowledge, experience and capacity among the local and central authorities to develop and implement comprehensive and survivor-centred reparations initiatives;</li> <li>g) The absence of adequate legal frameworks and mechanisms to provide reparations and long-term sustainable care for the survivors of CRSV.</li> </ul>
