Qualitative achievements against objectives and results during this reporting period

Output 1

- **Deployment of Graphic Design Advisor:** UNOPS was requested to recruit a Graphic Design Advisor to assist the IHEC Graphic Design Team in designing the ballot and polling material for the CoR elections in March 2010. The Graphic Design Advisor was deployed in October. In January he went with a team of IHEC graphic designers to Dubai to monitor the ballot printing. The team also worked with the out of country voting country offices and helped them with the design and printing of all materials they needed. Working directly with the Graphic Design Advisor on a daily basis the team members received on the job training.
- **Deployment of Security Advisor:** UNOPS was requested to recruit a Security Advisor to work with the UNAMI Electoral Assistance Team and the IHEC. The Advisor acted as liaison between Iraqi counterparts and ensured electoral security matters were included in any dialogue on electoral activities. He attended high level meetings with Iraqi government officials and on a daily basis provided capacity building for the IHEC staff working with security related matters.

• Deployment of Public Outreach Advisor:

UNOPS was requested to recruit a Public Outreach Advisor. The Public Outreach Advisor worked closely with the IHEC to assess the work of the Public Outreach Department and provide advice to ensure the proper development and implementation of programme and processes. The Advisor also supported the IHEC on the planning and implementation of important press events related to the CoR elections.

Deployment of Consultant to the Tally Center

UNOPS was requested to recruit a consultant to assist in the design and implementation of designated electoral systems and or activities in close consultation with the EAT Chief Technical Advisor and the International Electoral Assistance Team (IEAT), the IHEC and other stakeholders in the electoral process. The consultant provided expert advice and assistance in the development of the ICT support systems utilized in the CoR elections. The main support areas were; Systems development; DEC Systems Support and Data Entry Centre staff supervision, training development and continuous improvement;

• Assessment of IHEC Tally Centre

UNAMI/IHEC requested UNOPS to procure a company to audit the ICT software and hardware infrastructure of the IHEC DEC and to ensure that it was secure and able to effectively support the CoR elections. A company was appointed to perform the assessment / review of the ICT software and hardware intended to tally votes. The company worked directly in the Tally centre in close corporation with both the IHEC and UNAMI team. Suggestions of changes were implemented as necessary.

Output 2

• Based on a UN security assessment, UNOPS was requested to contract additional static security to the IHEC building in order to allow the continued support and daily presence of the UNAMI EAT at the IHEC. A security provider was selected and deployed to cover these requirements.

Output 3

• There was no activity under Output 3 as the activities were finalised in 1st quarter of 2009

Main implementation constrains & challenges (2-3 sentences)

The main challenge for the project during this period was the concern that the security situation would worsen as the CoR elections in March 2010 approached. The Security Advisor deployed in 2009 continued his support to the IHEC and monitored closely the situation and difficulties.

The deployment of extra static security to the IHEC ensured that UNAMI EAT could continue their daily presence at the IHEC providing essential operational support to CoR elections.
