Advocacy for the access to health services for indigenous populations	<p>IOM held meetings with health authorities and other stakeholders working along the migratory route to advocate for the access to health services to be granted to the mobile indigenous population. IOM provided IEC materials to representatives of the Inter institutional Commission for Migratory Affairs in Los Santos.</p> <p>IOM also coordinated with health authorities for the activities to be implemented starting from August when the mobile indigenous population that has moved back to the country or origin will move again to Costa Rica for the coffee harvest. <p>Costa Rica: IOM continues to work in coordination with national stakeholders to ensure access to health services for mobile indigenous populations.</p> <p>Nicaragua: IOM works in partnership with UNFPA to advocate on the inclusion of migrants into pandemic preparedness plans and to disseminate information on pandemic preparedness, mitigation and response.</p> <p>Panama: IOM continues to strengthen partnership with national stakeholders to conduct pandemic preparedness activities for indigenous populations.</p> <p>Nigeria: IOM is following up on activities conducted upon previous funding to coordinate with national stakeholders for the implementation of future activities.</p> <p>Ukraine: IOM is liaising with relevant stakeholders at the national level to conduct pandemic preparedness activities with migrant population. IOM is also in the process of translating the basic counseling and communication skills manual to conduct training session for national stakeholders who might find themselves in a situation where they will have to counsel migrants, mobile populations as well as host communities in the event of a pandemic or any other crisis.</p>
