IOM/NCDM strategy for 2010 was also presented to directors and deputies from the Department of Health to discuss collaboration on future activities.	50%
Facilitation of a functional simulation exercise to test multi sector pandemic preparedness and response plans and advocacy for the inclusion of the needs of migrants and mobile populations in the plans	<p>IOM in collaboration with NCDM conducted a functional simulation exercise at the Svay Rieng Provincial Government Office to test four selected sectors of the multi-sector pandemic preparedness and response plans. IOM advocated for the needs of migrants and mobile populations to be included in the plans. Awareness raising activities for migrants and host communities conducted	<p>IOM held refresher training for migrants and civil society representatives on “Health Promotion and Pandemic Preparedness”.</p> <p>IOM trained migrants conducted pandemic preparedness and health awareness raising sessions during cultural orientation classes for resettlement beneficiaries, including Iraqi nationals.</p> <p>IOM held the event Health in Motion for Migrants on March 11. In cooperation with NGO partner, Refuge Egypt, Iraqi and Sudanese families have been provided with information on health issues, including pandemic preparedness and response.
