(A) Describe the project rationale based on identified issues, describe the humanitarian situation in the area, and list groups consulted.*	<p>The continuing and recently escalating conflict in Mogadishu is raising concerns in the wider humanitarian community. Resulting risks for the health of the conflict-affected and displaced population in and around Mogadishu have been outlined in the contingency plan and are summarized in the overarching background and needs analysis for this consolidated response in the related proposal by WHO.</p> <p>In line with the overall coordinated response, Muslim Aid, in particular, will provide health services to conflict-affected population through 12 health facilities in Afgoye and Baclad corridors and within Mogadishu.</p> <p>Muslim aid has been an active partner working in the mitigation of such kind of emergencies since it first arrived in Somalia in the year 1993, over the years MASFO has learnt to articulately respond to emergencies in Somalia context. Currently implementing various programs aimed at alleviating the prevailing situation in the country.</p> <p>Our country office in Mogadishu city has all times been monitoring the emergency situation and the level of its consequence to the population. Our extensive working experience in all the regions of Somalia has enabled us build rapport with the vast majority of the country population. We also run many other essential non Health programs that are directly and/or indirectly related to emergency Health response.</p>

If necessary, attach a table with information for each location.*	<p>Muslim Aid in collaboration with some of the UN agencies namely, the WHO, UNICEF and UNFP have carried out a series of health services to the IDPs in the Afgoye corridor, Bal'ad corridor and in Mogadishu through OPDs and OTPs and MCHs in order to provide basic health services, EPI and nutrition to mothers, lactating mothers, pregnant women and children under 5 who are moderately malnourished, sick and weak. the centres are 12 OPDs centres, 3 mobile teams for nutrition and 3 MCHs in this batch. the project is targeting specifically mothers and children U5 who are moderately malnourished, it will also provide nutrition and basic health services and Muslim Aid is proposing this to continue such services for one more year there are 40 health professionals of Muslim Aid ready for this project plus other support staff with the necessary capacity to run the program</p>
