3. BACKGROUND AND NEEDS ANALYSIS (please adjust row size as needed)

(A) Describe the project rationale based on identified issues, describe the humanitarian situation in the area, and list groups consulted.*	<p>Bulo Burto district of Hiran Region continues to be in humanitarian emergency due to the Deyr 2010/11 season rain failure that has deteriorated further the situation. The district is experiencing six consecutive rainy season failure resulting in poor pasture and limited water availability. FSNAU has reported in its 2010 post Gu Analysis that 69% of the local populations in Bulu Burto are both in Acute Food and Livelihood Crisis (AFLC) and in humanitarian emergency (HE). On the other hand, pastoral, agro-pastoral and riverine communities are increasingly facing crop failure and poor food production as the 2010 Deyr season draws on. Expectedly, assessments conducted by SAMRADO and HARDO that the pastoral, agro-pastoral and riverine households are expecting increasingly low incomes from the livestock and agriculture. The pastoral, agro-pastoral and riverine food crisis persisted as a result of cumulative effects of poor rain performance, high cereal prices and worsening insecurity. FSNAU post Gu' 10 analysis confirmed that Hiran sustained to remain in humanitarian emergency due to several seasons of drought and ongoing conflicts.</p> <p>Bulo Burto pastoralist, agro-pastoral and riverine situation is worsened by constant conflicts that resulted displacements and droughts that intensified as Deyr 10/11 season rains failed. These have been another burden to drought affected communities' resilience to resist and recover from the shocks. If not receive a support on time with appropriate intervention.</p>

If necessary, attach a table with information for each location.*	<p>SAMRADO and HARDO's needs assessment in this region indicate that whereas the situation is getting dire with each passing day, the communities are struggling to provide for themselves as well as ensure that they continue to preserve their asset base (livestock and farm production). To build on this existing capacity and will of the vulnerable to survive the drought, HARDO and SAMRADO is proposing to conduct two months drought response project to address two major needs. First, the project will meet rehabilitating existing canals and water catchments through cash for work. This will then address the second need-poor household incomes and poor access to credit. The use of cash for work is ideally meant to provide incomes to households. However it will also help the communities prepare their irrigation canals and water sources for the next rain season hence achieving a dual purpose of increasing purchasing power and improving the existing community asset base.</p> <p>* The FSNAU report highlights that the food security and nutritional situation of the Hiran region continue to be in a state of</p>
(C) List and describe the activities that your organization is currently implementing to address these needs.	<p>With funding from Oxfam Novib, HARDO is currently providing emergency livelihood assistance to pastoral, agro-pastoral, riverine and IDP communities in Jalalaqsi district o Hiran region, while the proposal is focusing village under B/weyne and B/burte which did not benefit from these opportunities.. The key activities include rehabilitation of irrigation structures and water sources in selected areas, provision of cash relief to the most vulnerable households unable to participate in cash for work activities. Nonetheless, as the emergency situation continues to worsen, more and more people are increasingly becoming vulnerable and hence outstripping the existing resources. This is why this proposal is being made to address additional need.</p>

They will be informed of the project objectives. The mobilization will also ensure that Village Project Committees (VPC) and beneficiaries are identified with the support of the CPCs. This Participatory approaches will reduce conflicts and update the beneficiaries and other stakeholders on the project.</p> <p>The beneficiaries of project will target the most vulnerable and destitute households, destitute women headed households, widowers, the marginalized members of the pastoralists, households with malnourished children and households with pregnant and lactating mothers. For effective selection, the project team and established local committees will agree on the selection criteria which will be used for identification. Each pastoral, agro pastoral and riverine settlement will have a five-member committee formed and participating in implementation. They will comprise of three men and two women. These committees will participate in mobilization, identification of the beneficiaries and participate in the monitoring of the project.</p>

The M&E exercise will be undertaken by the implementing staff working closely with the community project committees that on daily basis will follow the activities towards the achievements of the project outcomes inline with the project document. Each project component will be responsible by staff that has the competencies needed for that section to supervise and ensure the required standards. They will also ensure that gender dimensions as cross-cutting issue to be considered in all project activities through all its stages. The project manager will be responsible for the supervising of the whole project as well as ensuring the participation of project communities as community participation creates project ownership and thus the communities provide the required maintenances to their projects and the project will be sustained. He also has the main responsibility of managerial and technical advice of the project. An interim report will be shared with donor. The final report with support documents and photos will be submitted to the donor within the reporting period.</p>
