3. BACKGROUND AND NEEDS ANALYSIS (please adjust row size as needed)

(A) Describe the project rationale based on identified issues, describe the humanitarian situation in the area, and list groups consulted.*	<p>According to Swalm/FSNAU (July-Dec 2010), parts of central and south Somalia are the hardest hit by the La Niña, with poor grazing conditions and many water sources drying up, many pastoralists are forced to go in search of water and fodder. The few remaining water points like the shallow wells, water catchments and berkads (underground water tanks) are drying up in Beletweyne districts in Hiraan region. If emergency water supply is not received, this will lead to catastrophic problems for the communities of Hiraan and their livestock animals.</p> <p>Elders and community members in different parts of Hiran region have approached and reported to GEELO field staff, lamenting that the severe drought has already resulted in livestock death and livestock carcasses are seen in some areas, especially in the Adoon zone where lack of water has reached critical levels. Most affected are cattle and small shoats; goats and sheep. 10% of goats and sheep and 15% of cattle are reported died (local and media; hiraan online and BBC somali service, dec'2010-jan'2011). Many camel calves are reported dying due to poor vegetation and lack of water.</p> <p>To address the extremely limited access to water, GEELO will provide vouchers to identified poor and vulnerable households to enable them access water from private suppliers. (60% of these households are Female headed households). Out of the six villages only one has a borehole that is functioning and the water supply is not adequate. The most vulnerable households will be provided with water vouchers to assist them collect water daily from temporary water storage facilities that will be provided by GEELO at startegic positions/locations. for a period of 2 months. According to WASH guidelines, each beneficiary is required to consume 5 litres of water per day, which means 40 litres is needed for a family of 8 per day. The berkads will be filled daily to ensure sufficient water for</p>

If necessary, attach a table with information for each location.*	<p>According to FSNAU post GU Nutritional Technical Series report covering the period of July-Dec 2010, a significant number of people in Hiraan remain in crisis. The most affected livelihoods in Hiraan include central Agro-pastoral (Cowpea Belt) with 2000 people in HE and 5000 in AFLC, followed by Southern Agro-Pastoral with 28,000 people in AFLC. The Agro-pastoral areas of Hiraan region have faced 5-6 consecutive seasonal failures with poor access to milk, crops and income, due to poor rains and constant conflict in Hiraan, Reduction of pasture, fodder and limited access to water will result in high livestock mortality rates. Crop prices will rise considerably due to the huge demand. Most vulnerable households will not be able to purchase food and water. Though statistics might be limited, there is evident of gender disparity in women's access to water and pasture resulting from limited mobility, hence GEELO will include these beneficiaries in the water voucher and provide water. GEELO plans to target the most vulnerable households in 6 Villages in Beletweyne district and engage Berkad owners in the 6 villages that do not have a functioning well. The berkads filled with water will be chlorinated and beneficiaries with water vouchers will collect water on daily basis for 45 days. Free Residual Chlorine (FRC) will be maintained between 0.3 and 0.5mg/l and verified twice a day for bucket chlorination. If bucket chlorination cannot be achieved, at the</p>
(C) List and describe the activities that your organization is currently implementing to address these needs.	<p>GEELO is currently implementing a WASH project in Hiraan region supported by the CHF (formerly HRF) which focuses on hygiene promotion, construction of latrines and distribution of water filters. GEELO is implementing a livelihoods project that focuses on water catchment rehabilitation, secondary canals rehabilitation and feeder roads rehabilitation in Hiraan with FAO and a health project funded by ECHO, in partnership with CESVI and focuses on Mother and Child Health care (MCH) in Hiraan region.</p>

Other methods include project reports, field surveys, participatory methodologies and photographs. Field staff will work with village community Elders to identify target beneficiaries and discuss project work plan. Field staff will also visit sites on at least a monthly basis. Gender as a cross cutting issue will also be considered throughout the project implementation. During the project implementation period, GEELO will measure the project outcome by ascertaining the number of target beneficiaries in the 6 villages in Beletweyne district who have improved access to water.</p> <p>The following is the selected project outcomes that will be measured. • # of beneficiaries with access to water through water voucher system (photos, beneficiary signature list, vouchers)</p> <p>Project activities will be monitored through the project work plan.
