3. BACKGROUND AND NEEDS ANALYSIS (please adjust row size as needed)

(A) Describe the project rationale based on identified issues, describe the humanitarian situation in the area, and list groups consulted. (maximum 1500 characters) *	Dhusamareeb District like other parts of Somalia has experienced the effect of La Nina phenomenon characterised by higher than normal temperatures, persistent drought and no rainfall. The situation continues to deteriorate with the beginning of long Jilaal dry season. Water sources including berkads (cement lined underground water tanks) and water catchments are completely depleted as well as pasture that has impacted to animal migration and increased competition amongst pastoralists. As a result, livestock body condition has deteriorated leading to their low market values while unknown number of livestock death has been reported in some places. The situation is exacerbated by food insecurity and high malnutrition rates as crop production along the riverine areas has been significantly reduced while there has been total crop failure in agro-pastoral livelihoods of Southern Central Somalia including Dhusamareeb district. According to FSNAU post-Deyr February brief, 60,000 of the population in Galgaduud is in HE and 55% of the population is in AFLC. UNHCR reports shows that drought and not insecurity has become the major cause of displacement with many

(maximum 1500 characters) *	Eldhere has a population of 20,100 persons including 2,100 IDPs and 18,000 host communities. IDPs and host communities are integrated and they are living with their relatives. There are approximately 1,300 IDPs that travel through Eldhere in search of water and pasture for their livestock. There is only one shallow well in Eldhere that serves the water needs of these communities that has no any water source. The distance between Guricel and Dhusamareeb is about 30 Kilometres apart and is served by only one shallow well whose water level reduces dramatically during dry seasons, thus there huge need for a borehole. The new borehole in Eldhere will serve not only the host community but also IDPs and pastoralists that travel through the village in search of drinking water for their livestock.

(maximum 1500 characters)	Guricel has a total of 9 IDPs camps with a population of 10,284 persons. The IDP camps are Hagay, Cagaf, Ujuran, Ujuran, Ceel Cali Rehabilitating 15 berkads in Guricel and surrounding villages

(W) Implementation Plan* Describe how you plan to implement these activities (maximum 1500 characters)	IIDA Womens Development project staffs in collaboration with community elders, local administration and women household heads will mobilise and sensitise the target communities about the project. Tendering will be carried out in an open and transparent manner and the winning bidder chosen. The contractor will drill a new borehole in Eldhere village in a central location that is clearly visible to every member of the community, and construct 50 latrines in two IDP settlements in Guricel. Water committee members comprising of 15 women and 15 men will be trained on the management of newly drilled borehole by IIDA WASH staffs. 7,456 most vulnerable members of communities in Guricel from very congested families and 7456 IDPs from Eldhere will be trained on household water treatment skills by a consultant supported by IIDA WASH staffs. Women household heads, teachers community health workers supported by IIDA WASH staffs will conduct hygiene promotion campaigns to disseminate good hygiene practices to benefit 8,056 displaced persons in Guricel.

IIDA Womens Organizations project staffs supported by the women household heads, community elders and local administration will monitor the project on daily basis throughout the project cycle while evaluation will be conducted by an independent external evaluator at the end of the project. Project monitoring will be continuous and will include both monitoring of the impact of the implemented activities and its effectiveness in achieving the result indicators. The project manager and field staffs will carefully monitor the project on daily basis and document all activities to ensure effective implementation and in particular of the project. The project manager will produce monthly progress reports on activities till their completion. Monitoring from project start will be supported by the use of a logical framework. The project manager and project staffs together with stakeholders will ensure that monitoring and evaluation information is recorded in an accurate and consistent way, and that reporting is done in a timely manner. All stakeholders (target beneficiaries, IIDA project staffs, community elders and local administration representatives) will review the project progress to ensure the set project goals are achieved. Documentation of all project activities will be done to ensure effective implementation, progress reports recorded on monthly basis and monitoring and evaluation information is compiled for success stories. The final report and evaluation report will be shared with OCHA. IIDA offices are located in Guricel and the project staffs are living in Guricel. The borehole drilling in Eldhere will be monitored on daily basis by IIDA project staffs living in Eldhere in collaboration with community elders and local administration representatives.
