(maximum 1500 characters) *	According to the FSNAU Post Deyr '10/11 Juba regions recorded a GAM rate of 30.7% and SAM rate of 7.8% among the pastoralist, GAM rate 26.1% and SAM of 6.2% among the Agro-pastoral and GAM rate 29.7% and SAM rate of 6.4 % among the Riverine thus according to the FSNAU nutrition assessment that was conducted in December 2010 ..According to the same assessment conducted in December 2010 reported that nutrition status has deteriorated due to a combination of factors such as the deteriorating food security situation, lack of clean water which increases diarrhoeal disease and reduced access to milk. The number of malnourished children increased by about 7 percent and is currently estimated at 241,000 children under 5 years of age as acutely malnourished, of which 57,000 are severely malnourished. Of great concern are the Southern regions, currently in Critical to Very Critical phases, are most affected by food insecurity and limited humanitarian interventions. The FSNAU february 2011 briefs shows that failure of the Deyr seasonal rains linked to prevailing La Niña event affecting Somalia caused a severe water crisis in most parts

(maximum 1500 characters) *	The FSNAU Post Deyr '10/11 food security analysis indicates a rise in the number of people in both rural and urban Livelihoods in middle and lower Juba are facing a food security crisis from the estimated 95,000 in Gu '10 to about 180,000 people, currently of whom 85,000 are in Humanitarian Emergency and 95,000 are faced with an Acute Food and Livelihood Crisis (AFLC). The nutrition situation in the two Juba regions is Very Critical , and all the three livelihoods are equally affected by extremely high levels of acute malnutrition. The deterioration is linked to food security related factors on one hand, where the failure of the Deyr '10 season of rainfall has led to poor crop and livestock production. These, together with high cereal prices, low terms of trade, and abnormal livestock outmigration has contributed to reduced food (milk and cereal) access at the household level. Moreover, high morbidity, a major risk factor to acute malnutrition, persists in the regions. The situation is worsened by the withdrawal of certain humanitarian organizations in the area providing health and nutrition services due to the prevailing civil insecurity in the area. SORDES is fully committed to treating women and children properly. Currently, Hagar MCH/OPD provides consultations for under five year children, pregnant women and it also holds Health Education four times per month. Other indirect programs that Sordes is running include Somalia Interaction Radio Instruction Programme (SIRIPIII) supported by Education Development Centre (EDC/USAID), Emergency drug supply supported by WHO, Supporting of Five primary schools through the Diaspora community and Non Formal Education (NFE) in 2 centers in Juba. Sordes has submitted a joined health and nutrition proposal to UNICEF and assurance of Gift in Kind is imminent.

The nutrition activities will recognize local customs, and aim to minimize the burden on daily household and community routines. Community and beneficiary participation will be required at different stages of the proposed project to ensure transparency and allow for adjustments based on feedback. Community mobilization through public meetings involving all members of the community will be held to discuss the proposed project. This will help to maintain transparency with the beneficiaries and non-beneficiaries throughout the project period. Community leaders will be consulted regarding locations of OTP/SFP sites. The OTP/SFP sites will be fixed and will operate 6 days per week, each fixed site will comprise of 1 nurse who will be in charge of provision of therapeutic treatment, 2 nutrition assistants who will be taking anthropometric measurements and support the nurse during appetite test and provision of

Sordes will be responsible for monitoring and supervision. CHF will be allowed access to the feeding centers to conduct periodic spot checks to ensure that activities are implemented as planned during the period of project implementation. Joint monitoring and supervision, using standard checklists will be used to monitor progress. Submission of monthly reports of project activities on a regular and timely basis is mandatory. In the event that access to the project site is restricted, due to increase of security phase or as advised by the UN Department of Safety and Security (DSS), Sordes will assume full responsibility for supportive supervision visits, review and records and reports and complete and submit to CHF, on a regular basis, the standard monitoring and supervision checklist. In the event that CHF access to the project site is restricted, due to increase of security phase or as advised by the UN Department of Safety and Security (DSS), Sordes will consult with CHF to determine if Sordes is able to assist CHF staff to make support visits and to review records and reports. CHF visits to the Sordes project sites will be agreed in consultation with Sordes and according to Sordes own internal security protocols and analysis. Sordes should travel to the project site be restricted because of insecurity, Sordes will provide CHF with the requisite information in Nairobi.
