### 3. BACKGROUND AND NEEDS ANALYSIS (please adjust row size as needed)

(maximum 1500 characters) *	Somalia has been in perpetual humanitarian emergency since the fall of the former central government twenty years ago due to leadership wrangles between varying warring factions including clan based warlords and Islamist fundamentalist groups coupled with cyclic droughts and floods in an already fragile environment. It is clearly evident that the humanitarian situation in Gedo is in humanitarian emergency. The "deyr" short rains of 2010/2011 failed and translated in to drought affecting the entire region. Pastoral and agro-pastoral communities experienced huge livelihood erosion due to rain failures that turned to be drought. The gu 2011 rains have failed too or far below averages accompanied by intense fighting between TFG forces and Al-shabab. The TFG captured all the districts of Gedo from Al-shabab except Bardera, while Al-shabab imposed sanction of the TFG controlled areas including Luq. Local food production has been interrupted by conflicts and drought while livestock death especially cattle reached the pick due to lack of water and pasture. Food and market access for drought affected people in Luq district remained critical. Prices of locally

(maximum 1500 characters) *	The two successive rains Deyr 2010/2011 and the following Gu 2011 failed in Gedo region. The conflict between Al-shabab and TFG in Gedo is felt by the civil in a different way from the warring groups. The impact of these rain failures and conflict is compromising the lives of many people in Luq district of Gedo region and surrounding districts. Farming activities in the agro-pastoral areas potential for stable food production has been abandoned for 2 seasons due to lack of poor rainfalls. Livestock body condition continued to emaciate, lost monetary value and finally started dying in huge numbers especially cattle. Access to food and other income for drought affected people has been ruined by both drought and Al-shabab blockage, the price of food has risen 53% in all southern Somalia, and therefore the cost of minimum basket has changed very dramatically. In addition Huge number of people has been displaced from the neighboring districts of Bay and Bakool to Luq. ADA in collaboration with Luq community leaders and drought committee did an observation assessment in the newly arrived IDP settlements that developed makeshift

<b>(W) Implementation Plan*</b> Describe how you plan to implement these activities (maximum 1500 characters)	The project covers drought affected households in Luq; poor households, pastoral dropouts, agro-pastoral dropouts, urban poor affected by Al-shabab blockage and will be implemented ADA. The project will target 1700 households. The target beneficiaries will benefit from food vouchers activities and will have access food for 3 months. ADA selects and provides beneficiary with serialized food voucher-bearing name, sex, household size, location, amount of food, month of distribution and signature. Beneficiary redeems food voucher with the food vendor- The Food vendor then collects payment from the money vendor using the vouchers. The project is participatory based and community will involve and constitute implementing committee to assist in the selection of target beneficiaries. In the free food vouchers distribution, the project will set clear and agreed selection criteria for the IDPs. The following criteria will be used for selecting the target beneficiaries: must be an IDP, last household livelihood to either drought or conflict

Monitoring activities will be carried out by designated project manager and field monitors. The allocation of responsibility for monitoring, what should be monitored and how it should be done will be clearly defined and included in the strategy of the implementation. It will be participatory, i.e. it will be participated by staff of implementing partners, beneficiaries and other stakeholders as/when required. The project will initiate community project committee to involve the community in the project. These committee will participate in the selection of the beneficiaries and food distribution. ADA management will validate each activity to make sure that all activities are in line with the plan. The project targets the 4 sections of Luq town where the drought and conflict IDPs settled as well as the urban poor people. ADA and community project committee will do weekly meeting at the field level sharing experiences and challenges forward strategies. Monitoring activities will include the following methodologies: 1) Scheduled or random visits to local communities; 2) Focus group discussions with project beneficiaries; 3) Regular meetings and discussions with local authorities; 4) Periodic analysis of baseline data gathered from the above visits and discussions. 5) Analysis of monitoring reports. 6) Analysis of financial reports and level of implementation against planned activities. Besides, the project will produce relevant documents such as copies of vouchers, payment sheets, signed beneficiaries' recipients' sheets. Other evidences to be produced include videos and pictures of projects during implementation. The following indicators will be used to measure the project: - The number of beneficiaries supported with food vouchers and accessed food. Monthly food basket distribution is the bases of the
