3. BACKGROUND AND NEEDS ANALYSIS (please adjust row size as needed)

(A) Describe the project rationale based on identified issues, describe the humanitarian situation in the area, and list groups consulted. (maximum 1500 characters) *	A prolonged drought and high food prices in the larger horn of Africa and particularly Ceel Waaq district of Gedo region of Somalia has left a poor Pastoralists/IDPs selected population of about 26,598 beneficiaries out of a population of 45384 people in above mentioned 14 villages which are seriously affected. The selection of the most needy poor pastoralists/IDPs was participatory which included community representatives, local administration and soma-action. Criteria used: priority was given to female headed households, IDPs, household with malnourished children and the elderly. The number of IDPs selected is 9600 persons, while 16998 persons of host communities are targeted. Number of IDPs refer to UNHCR assessment in the end June 2011, who distributed NFI in mid of July, 2011. □ During the drought, all the 14 shallow wells in the area dried up, the main source of water for the pastoralists and their livestock. The main productive borehole was Damassa, far from the 14 settled villages with an average distance of 57km (ranging from 28 to 140 km).

(maximum 1500 characters) *	The fourteen villages in Ceel Waaq district of the Gedo region of Somalia have been hard hit as a consequences of prolonged drought and insecurity. This villages have a combined population population of 26,598 people in 4,433 households targeted for food assistance. Sampled household information from Soma Action shows that over 80% of the population cannot afford more than one meal a day. This is not enough to provide for the calories required for day to day activities. The food voucher system will therefore be necessary as an emergency measure for four weeks to assure access to food, to the pastoralists/IDPs. The common ailments according to the local health providers are high malnourished children under 5yrs, diarrhea and common cold. See attached excel table for information on households and population in the fourteen villages.
(C) List and describe the activities that your organization is currently implementing to address these needs.(maximum 1500 characters)	Through the completed water voucher program, Soma Action undertook water provision and hygiene promotion. The organization has also undertaken chlorination of water, and peace dialogue among communities conflicting due to water and pasture shortage, and water pan rehabilitation. The water pan has collected rain water which is currently being used by the population. Soma Action has also been lobbying humanitarian organizations such as UNICEF to come in and help address the situation.

The project work plan will be key in the monitoring of the project. The matrix of food supplied and the vouchers signed as well as randomized routine check-ups will be critical in affirming that beneficiaries receive food total of food basket per month 95kg rice/wheat and beans, 6kg of pulses 4lts of veg.oil and 5kg of sugar. A vehicle will be hired for the duration of the project to facilitate monitoring. This will be done on a continuous basis in order to avoid issues that may arise and inform the need for change in project strategy if necessary. The data from these forms will be collated to calculate the total number of beneficiaries and the amounts of food provided through voucher. The data will be analyzed to determine if all beneficiaries are receiving food as planned and their satisfaction with the procedures utilized. The findings will be used to adapt project implementation strategy as and when required.
