(maximum 1500 characters) *	The drought-stricken populations in Tiye glow District, Bakol region, are in a humanitarian crisis due to crop failure, loss of livelihood assets. July FSNAU 2011 assessment ascertains high loss of assets, livelihoods such as livestock, crop failure, food and water scarcity and high prices. Current emergency scenario has witnessed loss of both human and animal lives due to starvation, lack of water, malnutrition, under-nutrition, opportunistic diseases and cases of AWDs. FSNAU-FEWSNET July 2011 situational report confirms high prices of food due to two consecutive seasonal failures of rains, high marketing costs and in some areas restricted trade and limited access to food assistance, increased livestock mortality, poor productivity and value of surviving livestock due to the on-going drought, and increased civil insecurity have led to severe reduction of food access by poor and neediest households, acute malnutrition, and increased crude mortality. This has led to famine (IPC Phase 5) in the highly populated Shabelle and agro-pastoral areas of Bakol. Food insecurity emergency is expected to persist within the next 3-4 months in
