(maximum 1500 characters) *	The overall food security situation in Bakool region has considerably deteriorated since post Gu 2010 due to the negative effects of poor rainfall performance. According to FSNAU reports, currently 158,546 in rural Bakool are in crisis and famine, with GAM rates as high as 51.7. The current crisis is driven by a combination of factors, including: poor rains resulting in crop failure, reduced labor demand, poor livestock conditions, and excess animal mortality. Additionally, local cereal prices across the whole south regions are far above average, more than 2-3 times of the 2010 prices and still continue to rise. As a consequence, the most vulnerable populations are unable to meet basic food needs and have very little capacity to cope with these food deficits. One of the highest recorded levels of acute malnutrition are reported in Bakool where the GAM prevalence is at 51.7% (FSNAU Report, 20th July 2011). To respond to these severe crisis in Bakool, BWDN and GREDO in consortium aims to support 1,854 agro-pastoral HHs in crisis with immediate access to food.

GREDO has partnered with various humanitarian organizations that include UNICEF, UNDP, WFP, ILO, NDI, NED, NRC, Concern World Wide, Novib, CARE, WFP and various International NGOs. GREDO and BWDN has a field office located at Baidoa and field offices in Hudur and Wajid. Both organisations have well established offices in Bay and Bakool with adequate staff. The two agencies are accepted in the local community and work closely with the local communities in the implementation of all their activities. □</p> <p>□</p> <p>In view of the humanitarian situation in Hudur and Wajid districts, food access is a major deficit and threatening loss of human life. <b>(W) Implementation Plan*</b> Describe how you plan to implement these activities (maximum 1500 characters)	<p>The project will be implemented by GREDO (as the lead agency) in collaboration with BWDN as consortium of cooperating NGOs. Project staff will consist of a program coordinator, two project managers, 2 supervisors, 4 assistant supervisors, 2 logisticians (50%) and 2 accountants (50%). The target beneficiaries will be selected based on their vulnerability, income and social level. The project will specifically target the poor, the old, the handicapped, households led by children and the IDPs and those that do not benefit from inter-communal support. The beneficiaries will be issued with serialized food vouchers indicating commodity value entitlement for each household on weekly basis. Alongside, the project will identify credible food vendors and money vendor in the town. The selection criteria for the vendors will be based on their geographical locations in town and good track record on dealing with food stocks and agreement will be signed for selected food vendors and money vendor. Project beneficiaries will be issued with food</p>

The project will be constantly monitored by GREDO, BWDN and the community committees established at each village. The monitoring will be conducted on daily basis during distribution. GREDO and BWDN senior staff will assess the progress of implementation on monthly basis. The local committees will be engaged in the monitoring activity. The methodologies employed will include: site visits, interviews with beneficiaries, review of the food vendors records and constant visit to food vendors shops during redemption of the food vouchers by beneficiaries. The monitoring will ensure that beneficiaries receive the complete and accurate food packages, that safety is ensured at the vendors shop and service by the vendors is satisfactory. The indicators of the project will be used during monitoring. The indicators will include: the number of beneficiaries targeted by the project, the number of food retailers contracted and the amount of food provided to beneficiaries every month. In addition, the project partner (BWDN) will deliver monthly reports to GREDO. BWDN will also provide progress and final report after completion of implementation. BWDN will also deliver project evidences such as beneficiary lists, photos of beneficiary and any other important document. Similarly, GREDO will provide progress and final activity and financial report to the CHF. Evidences of implementation will also be submitted to the CHF.
