3. BACKGROUND AND NEEDS ANALYSIS (please adjust row size as needed)

(maximum 1500 characters) *	From 2008 up to now, the GU and Deyr rains in this area Belet Weyne district of Hiran region were erratic and insufficient resulting in tremendously decline in livestock and crop harvest. The FSNAU report highlights that the food security and nutritional situation of the Hiran region continue to be in a state of HE and AFLC with an early warning of further deterioration over the following months. The situation was worsened by the recurrent droughts and conflicts that resulted displacements, 8 villages have been affected by the conflict through displacement. SAMRADO, KANAVA, KULMIYE, MRD, HWS and WARDI are conducted joint assessment to identify the magnitude of drought and conflict effects to the populations in Belet Weyne district. During assessment, focus group interviews were made with the local elders, representative's village. The survey has identified the major problems that affected the population are the food Shortage. Those IDPs at the most vulnerable people in Hiran region and faced on acute malnutrition and needed emergence assistance. So that SAMRADO proposed this project to help the IDPs in Belet Weyne. (maximum 1500 characters) *	SAMRADO's needs assessment in this region indicate that whereas the situation is getting dire with each passing day, the communities are struggling to provide for themselves as well as ensure that they continue to searching Food. To build on this existing capacity and will of the vulnerable to survive the drought, SAMRADO is proposing to conduct two months drought response project to address major needs. First, the project will meet food voucher <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The FSNAU report highlights that the food security and nutritional situation of the Hiran region continue to be in a state of humanitarian emergency and acute food and livelihood crisis with an early warning of further deterioration over the following months. □ Little support from the international and local humanitarian organizations is also another critical factor that has aggravated the situation.
(C) List and describe the activities that your organization is currently implementing to address these needs.(maximum 1500 characters)	With funding from CHF, SAMRADO is currently providing stander allocation project of livelihood assistance to reverine, communities in Belet Weyne district of Hiran region, and new borehole construction in Coomaad with funding UNICEF. The key activities include distribution seeds to the most vulnerable households unable to purchase. Nonetheless, as the emergency situation continues to worsen, more and more people are increasingly becoming vulnerable and hence outstripping the existing resources. This is why this proposals being made to address additional need.

They will be informed of the project objectives. The mobilization will also ensure that Village Project Committees (VPC) and beneficiaries are identified with the support of the CPCs. This Participatory approaches will reduce conflicts and update the beneficiaries and other stakeholders on the project. The food vendors are identified by SAMRADO with participation of the community and in open tender SAMRADO together with the food vendor agree on cost of food basket per month – 75kg of Maize, 3kg of vegetable oil, 5kg of sugar, 25kg of floor and 11kg of cow pea at a cost of \$83.5 per basket for household, Serialized food vouchers are then printed and disbursed to registered beneficiaries. Beneficiaries are issued with the food vouchers. The beneficiary redeems food voucher with the food vendor who are continuously informed by SAMRADO to ensure sufficient supply of food in the market through an efficient supply chain system. The project work plan and log frame will be used to monitor project activities. Other methods include project reports and photographs. Senior Field Coordinator will visit Community Elders to identify target beneficiaries and discuss project work plan. Senior Field Coordinator will also visit sites on at least a monthly basis. Gender as a cross cutting issue will also be considered throughout the project implementation focusing families with malnourished children to prevent death. During the project implementation period, SAMRADO will measure the project outcome by ascertaining the number of target beneficiaries in the areas of interventions who have improved access to food based on the indicators. The following are the selected project outcomes that will be measured. 14772 of beneficiaries with access to one month food which is 83.5 Dollar per HH as a food basket per month (photos when receiving voucher, beneficiary signature list, and vouchers) Project activities will be monitored through the project work plan. These include MOUs signed with the tender winners, Senior Field Officer's reports, photographs for all the activities conducted. The design of the voucher will be Name of the beneficiary, quantity of the food, Location, signature of the beneficiary and signature of the project manager. The community representatives will be engaged to launch the project and a great deal of the the casual employees will be vetted from these particular target groups so that the project is in the hands of the community and the indicators and output level are clear to the community elders. Performance reports will be submitted as per the requirement. Project progress reports and Final reports will be submitted.
