## LESSONS LEARNED

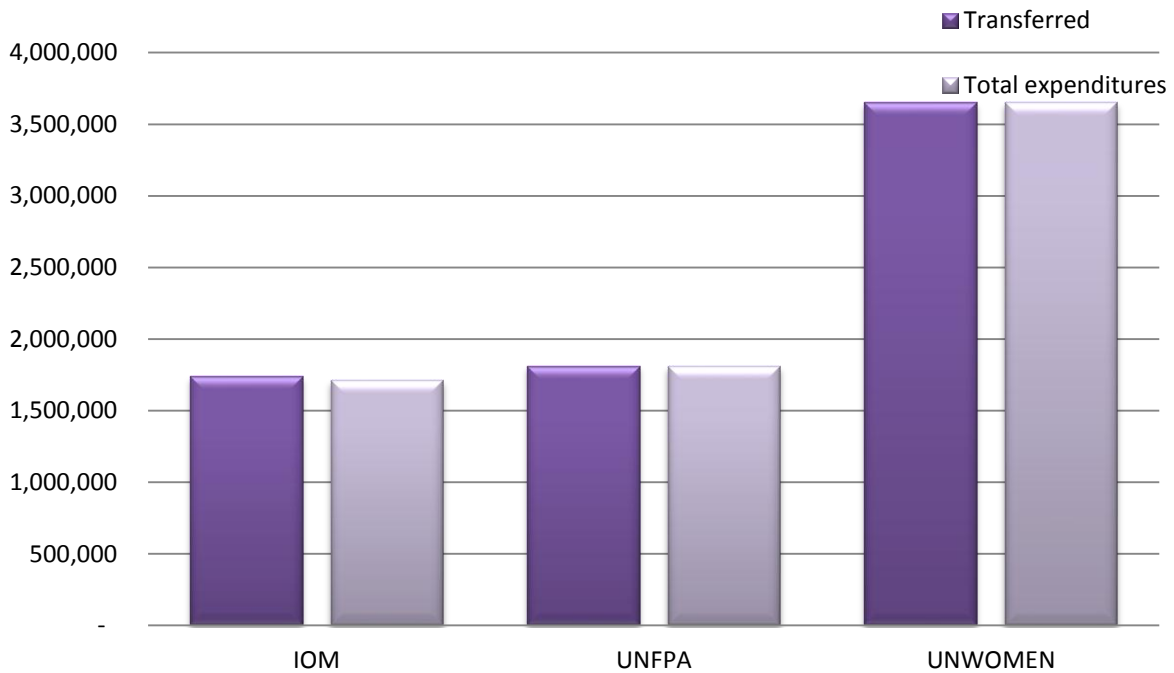
