### ACTIVITIES REPORTED:

#### Main Substantive Activities:

**Data Analysis:** the National Observatory on Violence and Crime carried out victimization surveys in each target city for a total of 44 neighborhoods. 26 students from three universities are enrolled in a programme aimed at supporting their research on violence.

**Violence prevention through community-empowerment:** 150 community youth leaders trained in art, leadership skills and Project management. 9 community-based radios broadcasting spots and shows on peace and violence prevention ongoing. More than 16,300 persons reached through awareness-raising activities, especially on GBV and domestic violence issues.

**Creation of economic opportunities:** 31 rehabilitation projects implemented by 31st December 2011. 7,349 persons received an indemnity for at least two weeks. One study on economic opportunities for youth available for each targeted city. Strategy for socio-economic opportunities designed.

**Response to women victims of violence:** 5 counseling centers providing support to more than 300 victims of violence. 111 victims accompanied through justice processes.

#### Problems and lessons learned:

Political transition weakens continuity in the implementation of the JP with the Ministries.

Lack of visibility of the programme at the local level.

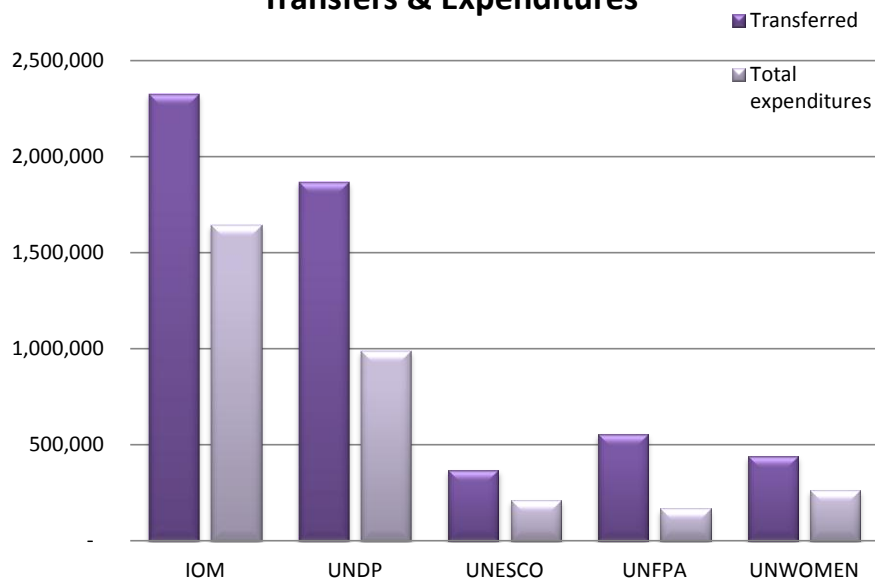
Joint design of complementary activities greatly improves interagency synergies
