The project work plan will be key in the monitoring of the project. The matrix of water supplied and the vouchers signed per delivery as well as randomized routine check-ups will be critical in affirming that IDPs/host community beneficiaries receive water 7.5ltr per persons per day. We are going to use photos, Billboards and video camera for the project during implementation/monitoring time. This will be done on a weekly basis in order to avoid issues that may arise and inform the need for change in project strategy if necessary. The data from these forms will be collated used to calculate the total number of beneficiaries and the amounts of water provided. Soma-action is based in Ceel Waaq and we are longtime partner with UNICEF and WFP, 10yrs partner with CARE somalia for Rural Food Security Project (RFSP) in Ceel Waaq district. We also have enough local staff which can access in our project area.
