Output 5 : Support to youth (women and men) for the training and development of projects and income- generating activities through micro-credit given	 The selected bank, BAO, disbursed 30 loans, as of 30th of September, for a total amount of 53 400 000 XOF; BAO has already approved 11 other loans and continued the assessment of the youth beneficiaries in Bissau, Cacheu, Gabú and Quínara. Provided a grant agreement is signed with a second Bank in the coming two weeks, it is expected that more than 70 business plans will receive funds before the end of year. The assessment report is expected within days, and then the negotiation process with the second selected bank will immediately start in order to establish a grant agreement. Training of trainers' sessions on GERME (How to Improve your Businesses) methodologies are under preparation (a first drafted of the training session plan was sent to the master trainer for his approval) and it is expected to start on October, 2010. 	45%

BAO is analyzing youths' business plans and has started to disburse the funds to youths.

The PMU is now operational and is gradually increasing its planning (through HACT/FACE approach), implementing and monitoring activities.
