In 2010 joint project was successfully implemented.

MDTF Office (under Atlas Business Unit MDTF1) transferred the funds to the UNDP Contributions bank account in Kyrgyzstan for Kyrgyzstan's One UN Programme at the end of November 2011. UNFPA and UNICEF received DAO funds on 22 November 2011. Because of UNDP's financial 2011 year closure (December 1), UNFPA and UNICEF did not have time to implement planned activities in 2011. No activities were carried out in 2011. After discussion and agreement with the Kyrgyz MoH, all planned activities for 2011 were postponed to 2012.

However, during 2011 we had several technical discussions and meetings with the MoH and other MCH partners to review achievement and lessons. All 2012 plans were prepared in consultation with the MoH.
