However the area is controlled by the AS who tends not to approve such types of interventions. For this reason it was proposed to do cash for work rehabilitating canals in Balcad and water catchments for livestock in Adale and Adan Yabal Districts. CFW will be done following FAO guidelines. The ultimate number will however be confirmed during the initial mobilization. Distribution of maize, sorghum and sesame seeds would be also required to provide long term support to the beneficiaries. This type of intervention will possibly be pursued during the next seeds distribution by FAO with the same beneficiaries.

CEFA is currently implementing two projects funded by FAO in Jowhar and Mahadday Districts. One project, ending in April 12, distributed maize and sesame seeds to 7,000 beneficiaries and carried out cash for work for canal rehabilitation to 2,624 beneficiaries. Each beneficiary has been receiving 72\$ per month. The other project, who just started in middle March 12, foresee the distribution of sorghum seeds to 6,800 households in Jowhar District. In addition, CEFA has been implemented an EU-funded project in the whole Middle Shabelle region aiming at improving the pre and post harvest storage techniques for maize grains and provided improved storage capacity like 540 Kg metal silos and 700 Kg dam liners to 6,100 beneficiaries. In the last year CEFA implemented the following projects doing CFW activities: (i) CFW for canal rehabilitation in Afgoye funded by CHF; (ii) CFW for canal rehabilitation and river embankments in Jowhar and Mahadday Districts funded by CHF(iii) CFW for canal rehabilitation in distribution of maize, cowpea and sesame seeds in Afgoye funded by the Italian Cooperation (iv) CFW for canal rehabilitation in Jowhar funded by FAO.
