#### Main Substantive Activities:

National Gender Policy reviewed, revised and approved by cabinet. Advocacy packages for MPs, to improve interaction with communities on gender issues, and gender based laws finalised. A customised SADC gender mainstreaming tool kit developed to provide guidance for sectors. UN Security Resolution 1325 and CEDAW have been simplified, translated into six local languages and distributed widely. Radio programmes on women's health being aired. Over 1,000 people trained on gender related issues. Gender dimension included in National Development Plan Module on Gender Based Violence (GBV) developed and mainstreamed into the University of Namibia's 1<sup>st</sup> year compulsory course for all students. Income Generating Activities and Small and Medium Enterprise toolkits (Agriculture, Literacy Empowerment, Business Management and Work Ethics) for women and girls finalised and training conducted. Cell phone SMS campaign on baby dumping was conducted through the local print media to inform prevention strategies. The Namibian police curriculum reviewed and gender sensitive modules are being developed. A national plan of action for GBV developed. Support to the operationalization of shelters underway. Male involvement in the prevention of GBV, sexual reproductive and HIV & AIDS training manual developed. Mapping assessment of women and child protection services in five regions completed. Gender Needs Assessment and Strategy for the Ministry of Education conducted and 500 printed. 1,689 community members reached in Kunene, Karas, Oshikoto and Ohangwena regions with key messages on GBV. National Statistical Profile on men and women in Namibia for improving availability of sex disaggregated and gender data developed and distributed. 454 children counselled, supported and referred through a phone line to critical protection services set up with JP assistance. 13,263 women provided training in economic rights. Technical training on business management, literacy, ethics tailoring and agriculture were completed. 41 (females 8 and 33 males) TOTs equipped with knowledge and skills on GBV,SRH, HIV & AIDS and facilitation skills for the promotion of gender equality.


