I. PURPOSE

Programme Description:	This programme was developed as one of the objectives of the UNDAP 2011-2015 and will strengthen the Uruguayan Government in the coordination and design of international cooperation programmes in the country. The joint programme will strengthen the Uruguayan Agency for International Cooperation (AUCI). AUCI was created by Law No. 18,719 and has the mandate of planning, designing, supervising, administering, coordinating, executing, evaluating, monitoring, and promoting international coordination activities, projects and programmes that implement the country's development policies.


III. IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING ARRANGEMENTS

To support the implementation of the UNDAP (2011-2015), the Government and the UNS in Uruguay agreed to establish the Uruguay One UN Coherence Fund; a common, un-earmarked, development fund, under the leadership of the Resident Coordinator. The Uruguay One UN Coherence Fund supports the coordinated resource mobilization, allocation and disbursement of donor-contributed resources for the unfunded elements of the UNDAF/UNDAP.

The Uruguay One UN Coherence Fund has several governance mechanisms to ensure proper management of funds, supervision of project execution, and monitoring of results. The mechanisms are: The Coherence Fund Steering Committee, The Coherence Fund Consultative Committee, The Management Committees, and the Administrative Agent (AA).

The members of the Management Committee are: the Uruguayan Agency for International Cooperation (AUCI), and UNDP.

IV. RESULTS

This programme was developed as one of the objectives of the UNDAP 2011-2015 and will strengthen the Uruguayan Government in the coordination and design of international cooperation programmes in the country.

Output 1: AUCI and Uruguay are strategically positioned in the national and international discussions on development cooperation.

International Seminar

- An international seminar took place from 30th to 31st August 2011 in Montevideo. The aim of the seminar was to discuss the role of Latin American countries in the international aid scenario among 27 high-level officials of international cooperation agencies in Latin America, experts from the Academia, practitioners and civil society representatives of the Latin American region
- The discussion evolved around the following key questions:
 - a. The concept of "middle income countries": implications and alternatives to the incomelevel classification for international aid allocation. The role of middle income countries in the international aid and development architecture.
 - b. Institutional challenges at the national and regional level for international aid in Latin America.
 - c. The global development architecture debate.
 - d. International aid and policy coherence.
 - e. South-South cooperation and triangular cooperation of Latin American countries.
 - f. Reflections for the Busan High Level Forum working agenda.
- The outcome document was printed and circulated among a wide range of agencies and actors involved in international cooperation in Latin America.

Fourth High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness, Busan, Korea

- An Uruguayan delegation participated in the Fourth High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness, Busan, Republic of Korea, 29 Nov to 1 Dec 2011.
- AUCI representatives led the following activities:
 - a. Presented the national position on South-South cooperation, triangular cooperation, and the role of middle-income countries (MICs) within the new international cooperation architecture (Panel II, Thematic Session 4: South-South Cooperation and Triangular Cooperation).
 - b. Pertinent stakeholders in Uruguay attained the Annual Report on South-South Cooperation by SEGIB was made available.

V High Level Intergovernmental Conference on Delivering as One

 An Uruguayan delegation participated in the V High Level Intergovernmental Conference on Delivering as One, Tirana, Albania, 27 to 29 June 2012 integrated by the President of AUCI, the Executive Director of AUCI, the Manager of relations with the UN System in Uruguay, and delegates from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

- Uruguay, and AUCI in particular, participated as such:
 - a. Speech by the President of AUCI during the Opening Session.
 - b. Speech by the Executive Director of AUCI in Workshop 3: Towards a more coherent, effective and efficient UN development system: Recommendations for action at the intergovernmental level.
 - c. Participation by AUCI's Manager of relations with the UN System in Uruguay and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the negotiations for the Outcome Document. The country's positions were presented on Delivering as One, the UN reform process, and upcoming QCPR.

ECOSOC - DCF

- AUCI participated in the Economic and Social Council as well as the Development Cooperation Forum, New York, 2-6 July 2012.
- AUCI's Director presented in plenary, the lessons learned in South-South Cooperation, triangular cooperation as well as the emerging challenges for cooperation institutions that seek to strengthen South-South Cooperation.

Output 2: AUCI's technological capacities to manage international cooperation and the effective processing of information related to it supported.

- AUCI is in the process of attaining a new web site and a new international cooperation map for Uruguay.
- AUCI is analyzing the system requirements and is working with the Information Technology office of the Presidency of the Republic to develop the framework for the new software.

and participation in international forums, regional discussions and the Untied Nations on the
new international cooperation architecture, the role of MICs, the importance of South-South
Cooperation, triangular cooperation. These activities will continue within this project as long as
funds continue to be available; once funds are depleted, AUCI will continue to seek alternate
funding.

Output 2: AUCI's technological capacities to manage international cooperation and the effective processing of information related to it supported.

• AUCI will seek to implement software on project management, registry, grant making, workflow and other similar.

Output 3: The visibility of international cooperation actions in Uruguay and AUCI's coordination role are strengthened through a systematic communication strategy toward the public in general as well as national and international institutions.

• Thematic publications on international cooperation will continue particularly in environment, energy, social area, Human Rights, and access to justice. Other areas that may be included are: production, agriculture and industry.
