#### **Development Goal and Immediate Objectives**

This preparatory project is aligned to the UN Governance Sector Team Outcome of 'Strengthened regulatory frameworks, institutions and processes of national and local governance'. The goals are:

**ICI**: 4.1.2: Develop framework for inter-governmental fiscal relations to ensure efficiency, transparency and equity while maintaining national fiscal integrity. 4.2.1: Engaging with civil society –adopt and carry out policies to stipulate civil society engagement in reforms.4.4.1: Delivering basic services.

#### **Outputs, Key activities and Procurement**

## **Outputs**

Output 1: Framework, legislation and policies for decentralisation and local governance developed through multi-stakeholder process.

<u>Output 2</u>: Generic systems in policy-making, participatory planning and budgeting, data collection, human resources management and organisational management developed and core competencies of decentralised governance stakeholders improved in selected governorates.

Output 3: The scope of the current project has been changed, and the following output has been introduced which replace the original outputs 3:

GoI has improved capacities to provide citizens with e-services in pilot sectors.

<u>Output 4</u>: Vertical and horizontal inter-government relations formalised with discussion forums in place and partnerships with international/regional municipalities created in selected governorates. (This output has been shifted to the I-PSM) however, some activities remain to be implanted.

- 1.9 Establish Dec and LoG Task Forces in targeted governorates

# **Qualitative Achievements Against Objectives and Results**

**Output 2, Activity - UNDP:** Although UNDP had fulfilled its obligations under Output 2 earlier in 2012, an additional activity was undertaken in partnership with the Local Area Development Programme (LADP). This consisted of undertaking a functional review of two Provincial Councils in the Governorates of Muthanna and Quedessyia. The focus of this technical assistance was to examine the critical interface between the Governor's office and Provincial Councils and vertical line Ministry departments across legislative and executive mandates. In particular, the review assessed the interpretation and practices of functional assignments in the light of effective service delivery.

This assignment will inform the LADP and IPSM projects on the reform agenda of local administrations which will be tackled from different angles by the future activities of those initiatives.

### **Main Implementation contraints & challenges (2-3 sentences)**
