Due to the evolvement of general situation in the country, the implementation of the program faced several difficulties and obstacles that caused a delay in the signature of the agreement from Cesvi side.

The project was supposed to be one year long and it had to integrate an Echo founded project. Unfortunately after December 2013 the change in the context changed also the donor strategy: Echo rejected our new proposal and CHF requested to reduce of the 50% the duration and the budget.

The formal duration of the project is from 01/01/14 up to 30/06/14. It's been signed by UNDP on the 11/02/14 and from CESVI on the 28/03/14 (on the same date it has been submitted the request of payment of the first installment equivalent to 138,372 USD). Our signature has been postponed after an internal discussion with the HQ about the opportunity and the financial capacity to implement the proposal of CHF without the ECHO project integration. The main issue was related to our permanence inside WHH compound, considering that, in September 2013, the-local authorities (RRC and Commissioner) had communicated us that the deadline to leave the WHH compound was on the14 April 2014. So we initially had planned to develop (or to rent) our own compound in NBeG in view of the ECHO funds support. Unfortunately without this project was not possible to have our own compound (too expensive compared to the available budget).

After a negotiation with RRC, Cesvi obtained on the 20/03/14, a written approval to remain in WHH compound until the end of the year. Following this decision, Cesvi has been able to reorganize its financial and logistic capacities to implement the project and signing the agreement.

However, after January 2014 the project implementation was also delayed because of difficulties in recruiting personnel. Apart from our team leader who is very effective, the other members of the team needed to be constantly monitored and have not been able to implement the programmed activities. On the 23rd of June our new Project Manager has arrived in Juba to take-charge of the pending activities.

The two months extension will ensure the achievement of the activities concerning Cash for work, distribution of fisher gear, and the realization of the formation as well as the monitoring about results.

After the storm of the 13th June part of our structures and equipment in the Nyamlel camp have been damaged. We will be able to give you more information about the time needed in order to finalize the project outstanding activities after our new Project Manager arrival in South Sudan on the 23rd of June visit on site.

As per difficulties arisen during these months, we kindly ask you to obtain 2 months no cost extension. Instead of the foreseen end of the project on 30/06/2014, the end would be postponed to 31/08/2014.

Moreover a slight change of the budget line is requested in order to optimize the project implementation. There is not change of the total budget but only a reallocation of budget lines regarding personnel, vehicles and transportation.

We did not added any new budget line but we reallocated the budget lines regarding the following categories:

- Relief Items and Transportation
- Personnel
- Vehicle Operating and Maintenance Costs

We have reduced the Vehicle Operating and Maintenance Costs in order to increase the transportation of material costs and the staff. Due to the delays described we evaluated that reinforcing our local staff will be essential to speed up the implementation of the activities.
