FINAL PROGRAMME REPORT FORMAT

MPTF funds supported the distribution of 180 metric tonnes of Ebola-related supplies between 26 September and 7 October. 56 metric tonnes were sent to Guinea, 67 to Sierra Leone and 60 to Liberia. The distribution took place in September 2014 at the height of the outbreak when there were hundreds of cases per day. They were therefore part of the initial surge of supplies that was critical in slowing the transmission of the virus and contributed to UNICEF's efforts to support community infection prevention and care for patients and affected children at the peak of the outbreak. The shipment supported by the MPTF included tents and tarpaulins for the isolation of possible cases; appropriate personal protective equipment; gloves; medicine and body bags. The flexibility of the MPTF funds allowed UNICEF to be innovative in products and processes and act nimbly in response to the supply demands as the overall response strategy came into focus. No delays or deviations took place from the initial plan envisaged by the project proposal and gender/environmental markers are not relevant to this project.
