NARRATIVE

Situation Update

The main objective of this project is to secure funding of UN Clinic staff positions for the period 1 July 2015 to 31 December 2015, to enable the clinic to operate 24/7, maintain inpatients beds and maintain isolation/holding capacity. 1 P5, 1P4 and 1 P3 staff are in post and financed by MPTF Fund. The recruitment process is ongoing for one P3 international medical doctor and two international nurses.

The isolation/holding unit is functioning, the routine and emergencies cares are effective. However, the clinic is currently understaffed and the staff turnover is high.

Key Achievements

- Isolation/holding units fully functioning
- The clinic is opened for routine care, 40 Hours per week
- The clinic is opened for emergencies, 168 Hours per week

Delays or Deviations

The recruitment processes (managed by headquarters) are still ongoing for one P3 international medical doctor and the two international nurses. One international doctor P3 is in post since 19 October 2015. The delay in the recruitment process risk to negatively impact the functioning of the clinic in the future since the current staff work significant overtime.

The delays in finalizing the recruitment processes for the staff in the UN Clinic implies that the funds provided fur staff salaries will not be fully disbursed until 31 December 2015, which is the current end date of the project. Considering the extension of the national Ebola response (Phase 3) until 31 March 2016, there is a need for the UN Clinic to remain at highest capacity and readiness beyond the current end date of the project. Thus, UNDP would like to introduce a no-cost extension for the project until March 31, 2016 in order to continue to ensure a the functioning of the Clinic throughout the Ebola response and until complete disbursement of the funds.
