The Bambari radio will be operated by its community multi-confessional managing committee, and supported by Internews in its editorial and financial management through a partnership Memorandum of Understanding. As such, Internews will act as a supervising partner of the radio, mentoring it into full autonomy over the six-month duration of the project. In coordination with Internews, the managing committee will hire the journalists, manage the equipment donated by Internews and other partners on month II, and raise and supervise the allocation of additional financial resources through the sale of broadcast air time. The ARC's action, coupled with that of Internews, will focus on training the local managing committee in exerting strong financial control over the radio's activities, dealing with the institutional and legal aspects of radio management, maintaining a strong community mobilization in favor of the radio, and approaching NGOs and IOs to gather funds that will help the radio sustain itself and reach complete independence by the end of the project. ARC will also provide the radio's technician with a complete training in technical maintenance, to ensure that the radio can overcome minor technical difficulties on its own. Finally, ARC will work with the radio's managing committee to establish listener's club in Bambari who will work to find local revenues. Over the first two months, Internews will take charge of paying the totality of the salary and operation costs of the radio through CHF funds. Starting in month III, a growing percentage of these costs will be taken in charge by the managing committee supervised by Internews, until that percentage reaches 100% in months V and VI. The managing committee will be made up of two representatives of the local authorities (the mayor and the prefect), the bishop or his representative, the central mosque imam, the president of the Islamic community, a women's representative of the Muslim community and two representatives (1 male and 1 female) for each of the three IDP camps. The managing committee will elect a president, a treasurer and a secretary, according to internal regulations that will be established jointly between Internews and the members of the committee. The radio's activities and those of Internews will be coordinated with other NGOs, IOs and international actors through the local coordination and civilian-military meetings. Internews and the radio will be represented in these meetings by the Humanitarian Broadcasting Trainer, who will slowly devolve representation and coordination responsibilities to the president of the managing committee, in agreement with other members of these coordination bodies, over the last two months of the project. There will be no sub-partner to the project. Internews will continue to provide support to the radio through its RJDH programs over 2015 and a monthly payment for the dailynews broadcast.

In Bambari: Indicators progress will be measured using sources of verification which will include attendance sheets, photos, trainer observations, project records, feedback from questionnaires, and the forthcoming Internews nationwide CAR information needs assessment conducted under a separately funded award. Any information that impacts project activities in a negative or positive way will be immediately used to adjust activities, as monitoring is an iterative process to inform more impactful programming. Any threatening feedback will be seriously considered for security and safety considerations. The Internews M&E manager and local M&E officer based in Bangui will be in charge of overall supervision of monitoring indicator progress. The Bambari-based local admin/office manager will be trained by the Internews M&E team in collecting, recording, reporting, and using information. The local admin/office manager will submit a brief report using a provided template on project activities, achievements, and challenges to Internews on a weekly basis. This report will also include a summary of audience feedback (complaints, praise, etc.) received via the phone number provided at the end of each broadcast. The local admin/office manager will also fill out a monthly indicator chart. The Bambari-based Internews trainer will provide daily supervision of the admin/officer manager's responsibilities. The managing committee of the radio station will also submit a monthly report to Internews on the direct feedback received from its consultations from the local population. In addition to call-ins, the population of the Bambari area will be able to voice their opinion and concerns via five (5) separate listeners committees or focus groups made up of 10 individuals each. These listeners committees will be representative of Bambari's different affected communities including one (1) committee representing the Muslim community, three (3) committees representing each IDP camp, and one (1) committee representing the Sudanese refugee camp. The listeners committees will include a guided discussion to elicit feedback including their information needs and their opinions on the radio station's programming.

In Bozoum: Indicators progress will be measured using the same sources of verification mentioned for Bambari. The Internews M&E manager and local M&E officer based in Bangui will be in charge of overall supervision of monitoring indicator progress. The Bouar-based local admin/office manager for Radio Siriri will be trained by the Internews M&E team in collecting, recording, reporting, and using information. The local admin/office manager will submit a brief report using a provided template on project activities, achievements, and challenges to Internews on a monthly basis. This report will also include a summary of audience feedback (complaints, praise, etc.) received via the phone number provided at the end of each broadcast.

Cross cutting issues

In the context of inter-community crisis such as that which prevails in Bambari, several public hearth, environmental and social problems arise. The exposition of such problems, be they linked to HIV/AIDS, GBV, management of environmental resources in proximity of the camps, etc., constitutes the very essence of the humanitarian reporting internews specializes in. The radio internews will set up in Bambari will not only be manned by journalists trained to cover these issues but will also seek to provoke debates and discussions within the corrmunity with respect to these issues, and facilitate the broadcasting of public interest messages produced by NGOs (GBV, WASH, HIV prevention, public health, camp management, etc.).

untability to affected Since early August 2014, Internews has been meeting and working with prominent members of all groups and communities in Bambari to determine the communication and information needs of the community and outline the bases of this multi-confessional radio project. Discussions are well underway and continue to this day to establish the foundation of a new multi-confessional/community man aging committee that is representative of all the civilian trends and parties present in Bambari. This managing committee will act as the radio's first line of contact and accountability to affected populations, since they will take part in its very management. The managing committee, along with the editorial team, will be heavily involved in the elaboration of the broadcasting schedule. Additionally, at least five listeners' committees will be out in place with internews' help in the Muslim neighbourhood, the 3 IDP camps and the Sudanese refugee camp. These listeners' committees will be consulted by the managing committee and Internews at least once a month to obtain and evaluate the public's appreciation of the radio's broadcasting. A needs assessment conducted by ws will also take place before December 2014. Finally, a phone number for the newsroon will be provided at the end of every broadcasting in order for the public and other parties to voice their appreciation or concern about the radio's programming and information.

Special attention will be exerted by Internews to ensure that women's groups are well represented amongst the Barnbari managing committee and the editorial team. The listeners' committee will be made up on a 50-50 basis between men and women, as will the distribution of radios. Furthermore, a workshop on the coverage of GBV themes will be organized for the journalists in collaboration with NGOs that operate in the field, in order to develop a special magazine for women, produced by women journalists. Broadcasting space will additionally be made available to NGOs and IOs who wish to communicate on gender issues.

In Bozoum, at least one of the three trained local correspondents will be a woman.

Safety and security *

At present time, Bambari remains a latent combat zone. While the situation in the previous two weeks has been relatively stable and calm, hostilities could erupt again at any given moment, deepening the existing inter-community tensions and jeopardizing the capacity of the radio to function. We feel that the best protection a community radio station has comes from the community itself, and its valuing of the services provided by the newsroom. This is why we have so far worked with all communities and armed groups in Bambari to ensure all parties' acceptance of the radio and their commitment to refrain from using it or considering it as a military instrument or target. Two weeks ago, Internews CSIT held several meetings with both the two ex-Séléka general Darass and Zoundeko, and with one of Bambari's Anti-Balaka commanders, to obtain their firm commitment in favor of the reestablishment of a radio station. We also met with the Sangaris and MISCA/MINUSCA commanders to ensure their passive participation in protecting the radio. This coming week, Internews' Director of Operational Security, along with our CSIT, will visit Bambari to establish a comprehensive security plan for the radio and the local and expat staff. We will also be cooperating with other NGOs to assess the security situation, communicate information and coordinate our response to given events that might threaten the radio, its staff or installation.

Bozoum being relatively peaceful and calm since a few months, the relay will be installed in a localion determined in collaboration with local actors. The trainer will stay at the Catholic mission, where both Cordaid and InterSOS live. The relay's equipment will be secured by a compound wall.

Access * 'max 1000 characters) The radio's physical location has been the subject of several discussions with various local actors over the past two weeks. Following a meeting held with representatives of all communities, it was agreed by all parties to establish the new radio in the former location occupied by Radio Linga, a few dozen meters away from Bambari's Cour d'Appel. The building had been occupied by elements connected with General Darass for more than a year, but following extensive discussions with him, he agreed to liberate the space for exclusive use by the rew radio. Internews does not currently have an office or guesthouse in Bambari but has already held discussions with other humanitarian actors based in town to envision how we could share office/living spaces. This will facilitate Internews' installation in Bambari, and its inclusion in the broader NGO/IO community. Both ICRC and the French Red Cross have expressed interest in hosting Internews for the duration of the project.

Internews does not have an office in Bozoum and will coordinate with local humanitarian actors to determine the best locations for the installation of the relay and the trainings. Caritas will be helping in that regard.
