Mercy Corps project was selected by the FSL Cluster for the second round of the 2013 Allocation in August 2013.

The PPA was signed between UNDP and Mercy Corps for the implementation of the above project in Unity State (Panyinjar County) among the host communities on 1 October 2013 and 7 October 2013 by the two parties respectively.

Mercy Corps managed to start all the preparation work for the implementation of the project in Panyinjar with all procurements of required seeds and tools and identified beneficiaries and cash for work projects in Chuk, Ganyiel and Nyal despite the flooding in all these payams which were totally inaccessible by road. During the first two months of the project implementation, (October and November) Panyinjar County was still flooded making any program implementation impossible though preparation and ground work was done. Implementation was intensified in December despite logistical problems hindering movement of inputs while implementation sites still cut off from the state capital, Bentiu. With all beneficiaries and projects identified and procurements completed, unfortunately fighting started in the entire Country making Unity State extremely insecure for implementation for the project.

The combined effect of floods at the start of the project and the more than one month conflict, more than two months have been lost for program implementation and despite the signing of the agreement between government and the opposing side Unity State still has remained insecure for activities to run smoothly. Logistical movement has been hampered with and Mercy Corps is not sure at this stage all the beneficiaries initially identified have not been displaced. This has created a lot of uncertainty on the initial preparation that had been done.

Mercy Corps has been conservative during this period especially at a time when Panyinjar was still flooded with minimal support expenditure hence a healthy budget to still support program activities as planned.

Mercy Corps therefore proposes a **2-months No Cost Extension** in order to continue with the project implementing for the 1,500 beneficiaries for cash for work and seeds and tools which are so crucial at this stage given the combined effect of flooding on last year's harvest and the crisis which has resulted into displacements. The budget is currently well balanced to continue and adequately support the project activities with quality implementation without further realignment on support cost.
