Medair's project objectives include emergency response to acute emergencies through the provision of NFI and emergency shelter in coordination with the Cluster, State Focal Points, partner organizations and local authorities in any of the 10 states of South Sudan. It also includes the responsibilities to act as State Focal Points in Upper Nile and Central Equatoria States.

Due to the sudden change in the security situation in South Sudan following the fighting which started in Juba on 15 December 2013 and quickly affected other parts of the country, Medair's NFI-ES emergency response teams had to delay responses due to insecurity and lack of humanitarian access in light of the civil unrest within many areas of the country as well as staff members leaving Juba to be with their families. Medair's capacities to act as State Focal Point in Upper Nile have been affected by the continuous insecurities experienced in Malakal. Medair's compound including office, warehouse and accommodation were looted in January 2014 and some national staff members are not able to resume work due to their ethnicity. Medair is currently working out of the UN-compound but as soon as the security situation becomes more stable is planning to re-install a proper office in Upper Nile State again. Due to the current restrictions put on South Sudanese staff members, Medair is planning to bring in more international staff members on short-term contracts as surge capacity. Medair is requesting a no-cost extension of the project period for 2 months (until the end of May 2014) to bring in extra surge capacity for the emergency response and set-up an office space in Upper Nile State.
