Nile Hope is an Indigenous NGO operating in Jonglei, Upper Nile and Unity States. Following insecurity in South Sudan the disbursement of funds has been delayed and Nile Hope has not managed to receive funds for activities on time to enable implementation and reporting as initially planned. The 2nd tranche of the funding was received late; according to our records, disbursement did not happen up and until 20 March 2014.

Nile Hope is requesting for extra time for up to 30 April 2014 at no additional cost (no cost extension) to deliver on the remaining set of activities.

- Disseminate behavior change messages through IEC materials, media and campaigns to 500 people (200 women, 100 girls, 100 men and 100 boys);
- I) Promoting access to justice through follow up training, building capacity of male and female police officers on GBV response to reach directly 12 police officers in Akobo;
- III) Conduct one stakeholders workshop and sensitization and awareness on GBV to reach directly 40 individuals (25 Men, 15 women) and including community leaders, Administrative authority, Youth Leaders Religious Leaders, Women Leaders and NGOs in Akobo

Owing to the insecurity early this year as aforementioned, access to Akobo was a challenge and some of the project staff could not access the implementation site on time as scheduled. The attack in Akobo UNMISS Base made our International staff to be evacuated and there was no flight to Akobo. Currently there is relative peace and Akobo remain calm, our team is also on the ground implementing the set of activities.

During the added time, we will be able to finish the outstanding activities and report by 30 April. 2014

Subject to satisfactory response to pending CHF Secretariat question, the cluster endorses the request. The requested extension is brief(1 month) and appears a high percentage of activities are already completed despite the contextual challenges
