ACF is requesting a No Cost Extension to this program for 3 months. In the first two months of the program, ACF teams in NBeG and Warrap were able to complete assessments and begin the procurement and contracting process for hardware activities. ACF teams also began trainings as planned. However, the insecurity that erupted throughout the country disrupted all activities in December. Following the restart of programs in early January, WASH activities were primarily focused on emergency response activities to meet the needs of the influx of13, 000 IDPs in Twic County. Therefore WASH staff and activities were concentrated on the emergency activities in January, which has caused a two month delay to the program. Based on current challenges teams in both NBeG and Warrap are experiencing in procurement, we estimate that all work can be completed in a quality manner by 30 June 2014.
