2. National Programme Progress

The questions in section two are intended to capture advancements and challenges that the National Programme has faced during the reporting period. 2.1 Narrative on Progress, Difficulties and Contingency Measures

The questions below ask for a brief narrative describing progress on the implementation of activities, generation of outputs and attainment of outcomes. It also asks for a description of internal and external challenges to National Programme implementation, as well as the contingency actions planned to overcome them.

2.1.1 Please provide a brief overall assessment of the extent to which the National Programme is progressing in relation to expected outcomes and outputs. Please provide examples if relevant (600 words).

A mid-term review took place late June 2013 by the three UN-agencies. The assessment of progress in relation to expected outcomes and outputs are used for this report.

In regard to challenges to National Programme implementation one major reason was identified namely the overly complex decision-making process. With two national implementing partners four people are required for approvals, i.e. the Chief and Vice-Chief of the REDD+ Taskforce Secretariat (as the first step), followed by approval by the NPD and the Deputy NPD.

Furthermore, since all documents have to be printed, required edits are made in writing (requiring the physical presence of individuals) and changes subsequently made by RTS staff. These frequent requests for clarification, edits, and additional information mean that the approval process is extremely cumbersome.

Nevertheless in general, many indicators have been achieved (although with some significant delays) for Outcomes 1, 3, and 4; whereas few indicators have been achieved in Outcome 2.

Outcome 1:

Output 1.1: Taskforce has been formally established on 26 February 2013, 8 months later than the original target. In actual fact, the TF did meet informally twice in 2012, but meetings were suspended pending formalization of the TF composition. ToRs of the TF were included in the Prakas that established the TF in February, 2013, 8 months later than the target.

Output 1.2: The Taskforce Secretariat was established in July 2012, one month behind target. It has organized two informal TF meetings, but no formal meetings as yet due to the delay in operationalizing the TF.

Outputs 1.3 and 1.4: Most indicators were achieved. For example, the REDD+ Consultation Group is being formed with self-selection processes for nine stakeholder groups. A contract for a comprehensive awareness raising programme has been signed with RECOFTC.

Outcome 2:

Output 2.1: Progress has been made with Fisheries Administration in identifying important elements of a REDD+ strategy for flooded forests and mangroves, but no progress has been achieved as yet with FA or GDANCP.

Output 2.2: Delay in signature of UNEP's SSFA has constrained progress; consequently, the only progress against indicators to date is completion of a literature review on local costs and benefits of REDD+.

Outputs 2.3 and 2.4: These two outputs were combined during the Inception Workshop. There has been little progress towards indicators in the results framework, although a policy brief on benefit distribution has been developed under output 3.2.

Output 2.5: This output was dropped as a result of a decision at PEB 4, but one significant result was achieved before it was dropped, namely an assessment of options for establishment of a REDD+ grievance mechanism.

Output 2.6: There has been little progress towards indicators in the results framework to date, mainly due to the delay in signature of the UNEP SSFA.

Outcome 3:

Output 3.1: Although the REDD+ projects and subnational approach Technical Team has not yet been formed due the delay in establishment of the TF, priority areas have been identified and processes for scaling up from project to sub-national approach initiated.

Output 3.2: Support to REDD+ pilot projects was achieved. Sales of carbon credits have not yet occurred for a variety of reasons.

Outcome 4

Output 4.1: The MRV Technical Team has not yet been formed due to the delay in establishment of the TF. The MRV/REL advisor was hired from 1/2013, 6 months late. Development of a joint training programme with JICA has been prepared; and design of national forest inventory is ongoing.

Output 4.2: Progress has been made to develop Cambodia Monitoring system. A report on the existing national and subnational classification is available. Discussions were initiated but national forest definition, land classification system and carbon pools to be considered were not defined yet due to the delay in operationalizing the TT.

Output 4.3: Substantial progress has been made to design the satellite forest monitoring system. Training on forest monitoring system by INPE, Brazil has been completed, and a national consultation has been undertaken. Report on Inventory of existing satellite and aerial imageries is under final revision.

Output 4.4: Substantial progress has been made to design the National Forest Inventory to develop emission and removal factors for REDD+ related activities. Report and database existing allometric equations are available. Accessible forest inventory data have been stored in the REDD+ secretariat, analysis is ongoing.

Output 4.5: There has been moderate progress towards indicators in the results framework; a training workshop on GHG Inventory was conducted. Recommendations are provided to establish adequate institutional arrangements and data sharing agreements required for implementation of the GHG reporting system.

Output 4.6: There has been little progress towards indicators in the results framework, although key drivers of deforestation have been indicated and data of existing REDD+ initiatives has been collected to develop the National RL/REL framework.

2.1.2 Please provide a brief overall assessment of any measures taken to ensure the sustainability of the National Programme results during the reporting period. Please provide examples if relevant. (250 words)

A mid-term review was decided by PEB4 and conducted in June and July 2013. The review team met with the key government agencies and produced a number of recommendations including on management arrangements of the Programme, such as the inter-relationships

among Taskforce Secretariat, PEB, National REDD+ Taskforce, and National Climate Change Committee with a view to improve the implementation of the programme and the collaboration and sharing of responsibilities between the agencies.

Capacity building events for key government officials are also helping to build a shared capacity and understanding of REDD+ and the National Programme.

3. Government Counterpart Information

Comments by the Government Counterpart (H.E. Chea Sam Ang, Deputy Director General of Forestry Administration):

The Ministries remain fully committed to the UN-REDD Programme as part of the national readiness process. This was reemphasized during the mid-term review conducted by a review teams composed of representatives from the three UN agencies: FAO, UNDP and UNEP.

The mid-term review highlighted that the programme has not made sufficient progress compared to the work plan but important decisions have been taken in this regard during the first half of 2013 with the development of the SOP and the mid-term review. The Programme Executive Board has further decided that the program should adapt and focus on priority activities. With the support provided by other frameworks to the Cambodia REDD+ Readiness Process and the coordination of this support it is possible to prioritize activities and still capture all the important activities.

The establishment of the REDD+ Taskforce and the Consultation Group will further allow us to make progress and coordinate the different initiatives supporting REDD+ in Cambodia.

Comments by other stakeholders (non-government):

CSO REDD+ Network:

The CSO REDD+ network consist of 20 national and international NGOs, academic and CBOs who provide support to CSO and IP representatives.

CSO and IP representatives have been actively involved in a number of processes supported by the UN-REDD Programme during first half of 2013.

Interim CSO and IP representatives for the Programme Executive Board have participated in the PEB meeting in March 2013. Although, the term of the interim CSO and IP representatives ended, the representatives still continue engagement in the PEB meeting until the new representatives selected to replace.

A Voluntary Facilitation Committee (VFC) has been formed in the first half of 2013 with the support of the REDD+ Task Force Secretariat (RTFS), in order to facilitate the selection of members of the Consultation Group. The tasks of the VFC are expected to be finalized during the second half of 2013. The VFC consists of NGOs, IOs, IPs and government officials. Several meetings have been organized to clarify their own TORs and develop criteria for the selection of the Consultation Group Parallel to this, a participatory selection process for IP representatives to the PEB and the Consultation Group was directly facilitated by the RTFS. Information on progress of this parallel process was shared with the VFC. The selection has been taking place and will cover the 15 relevant provinces when completed. This process is coordinated with local authorities and line departments (eg. FA Cantonment) in order to secure the necessary recognition. During this process basic information about REDD+ has been shared with IP and relevant stakeholders.

Up to June 2013, many applicants applied for the member of Consultation Group. However, there were none from community fishery and community protected areas. More outreach was conducted via VFC and the REDD+ Secretariat network and contacts.

Representatives from CSOs and IP have involved in REDD+ activities such as participated in coordination meetings on communications material on REDD+. Some of representatives from INGOs and NGOs will participate in the review committee during the second half of 2013. Newsletter on the progress of Cambodia UN-REDD program should be produced every 3 months to update and share information to relevant stakeholders on the implementation of the program.

UN-REDD program should speed up support to civil society to engage on specific technical areas via the technical teams and related roadmap implementation activities. The consultation on the development of National REDD+ strategy should also be conducted. As at the end of UN-REDD program in 2014, the National REDD+ strategy is expected to be developed. The comprehensive strategy should involve relevant stakeholders from the beginning of the development.

UN-REDD program should speed up the development of national guidelines such as FPIC and Safeguards (output 2.6). The national social and environmental safeguards for REDD+ and climate change should consider the existing policies, international standards and agreements on safeguards. CSOs have already initiated efforts for awareness raising on social and environmental safeguards and benefit sharing in REDD+. UN-REDD programme could engage these civil society platforms towards the achievement of output 2.6. Safeguards are protection measures to potential risks from the external interventions. This would involve multi-stakeholders engagement and consultation on existing practices and proposed principles, criteria and indicators on safeguards. Safeguards are protection measures to potential risks from the external interventions. Encourage Community and civil society organizations participate in monitoring and evaluation the implementation process of safeguard and FPIC.

The achievement in the output 1.3b on the concept note of CF Network establishment should connect to or support to the process of setup community forestry network and provincial community forestry coordination committee which has been already supported by other donor agencies, NGOs and civil society.

FA project support in Siem Reap province (output 2.1c) is it overlapped with awareness raising activity? The program should support to existing pilot projects and provinces that have more forest cover such as Prey Long, Mondulkiri, Rattanakiri, etc.

The description in section 2.1.5 "Pilot projects supported by the programme have now been

underway for more than five years". The supported pilot projects should describe which projects that support for more than 5 years?

There is a need to support at the grassroots level activities to manage forest sustainably. Although efforts have been made to stop illegal logging, development of policies and frameworks, deforestation and forest degradation is still happening. There is an activity on the output 1.3b to support Community Forestry (CF) and Community Projected Areas (CPA) networks. Under this activity budget should allocate to local CSOs who are working with CF and CPA networks for sustainable forest management (patrolling and law enforcement activities). Moreover, the funds should allocate to support CF or CPA network for meeting to raise any issues to develop their action plan, and to file the petition or complaint letters to relevant stakeholders. Further collaborations with NGOs and civil society could be facilitated to support this process as well as in incorporating co-benefit principle in REDD+ development to enhance community mobilization and active participation.

The FCPF REDD+ Readiness project should have widely consultation with relevant stakeholders for comment and feedback.

The FCPF has been supported 3 government officers, 1 IP, 1 CSO and 1 UNDP SC to attend the training workshop on Social Inclusion in Bangkok.

The non-government stakeholders look forward to participating also in the other substantive work of the National REDD+ Programme through the PEB, Consultation Group and Technical Teams and through the adoption of the Consultation and Participation Plan of the National REDD Roadmap which we expect will commence in 2013.
