NARRATIVE (Max 2 Pages)

a) Rationale for this project:

Sierra Leone has a centralized system of medical supplies. The lifesaving medicine and medical supplies are stored in the Central Medical Store in Freetown under the supervision of Directorate of Drugs and Medical Supplies, Ministry of Health and Sanitation. The central medical store supplies the medicine to the district medical stores located in the district towns.

Due to the bad roads, seasonal accessibilities and weak transportation capabilities of the Directorate of Drugs and Medical Supplies the transportation of the critically required medical supplies, to the remote health centers, Peripheral Healthcare Units (PHUs) and Mother and Child Healthcare Centers (MCHCs), are extremely challenging. The rainy season further exacerbates the situation and the already bad roads becomes close to inaccessible. Thus, most of these facilities remains without any medical stock throughout the year. On the other hand, due to the transport limitation the medical items overstocked in certain facilities cannot be redistributed and thus eventually expires without reaching to the facilities that are in critical need. Additionally, the retention of the expired stocks occupies the limited storage facilities in the district medical stores. Furthermore, the reverse distribution throughout the facilities are nonexistent

The project aims to strengthen the transportation capability of the Directorate of Drugs and Medical Supplies by providing off road 4WD mini-trucks one per each district. These mini-trucks will enable all weather access to the most remote healthcare center and transport the medical supplies and Logistic Teams of the directorate to the remote healthcare centers. This intervention is complementary to the Global Fund assistance of 13 trucks to the ministry. Where these 13 trucks transports the supplies from the Central Medical Store to the District. The proposed off-road minitrucks will further distribute the supplies to the remote PHUs. Similarly, the Pharmaceutical

Logistics team will be enabled to supervise, monitor and provide supportive guidance and feedback to the remote healthcare centers throughout the country.

The proposed 15 vehicles will be distributed one per each of the 14 districts and one for the central medical store. The reformed NPPU, (the pharmaceutical supply chain agency) and Directorate of Drugs and Medical Supplies will be responsible for the development of a fleet management plan. These vehicles will be used during distribution cycles and supervisory visit to monitor the drug management in the facilities.

The Global Fund supported 13 trucks are supporting the logistics between the Central Medical Store and Districts. These trucks are not fit for the onward distribution to the remote PHUs due to the rough and difficult to access terrains.

b) Capacity of RUNO(s) and implementing partners:

UNDP as the recipient agency will have the overall fiduciary management, quality assurance, monitoring and oversight of the project activities. UNDP will also be responsible for the implementation of the proposed activities, ensuring timely and quality implementation of the planned activities, reporting the progress and financial disbursement, ensuring the procurement and HR procedures are in line with UNDP standards.

A project board (steering committee) for the project will be convened and Co-chaired by UNDP and MoHS. The steering committee will provide overall oversight and guidance for the project implementation and ensure that the stated objectives are effectively met.
