- ICAO is currently working on development of an up-to-date database and associated visual mapping of passenger movements from one State/international airport to another. Such information will be helpful in assessing the risk of transfer of a number of communicable diseases, including Ebola and Zika, across international borders.
- ICAO, with a number of partners including WHO, the International Air Transport Association (IATA), Airports Council International (ACI) and the International Transport Federation (ITF) has developed an ICAO hosted website and a questionnaire concerning vector control at airports. This is important in the context of Zika for States undertaking a risk assessment concerning the likelihood that insects may board aircraft and be transported from an area affected by the Zika virus to a non-affected State. The questionnaire will be distributed to States and relevant International Organizations during June.
- Previously mentioned plans concerning the training of professionals involved in public health preparedness and response in the aviation sector continued to be developed during May.

Repeat AVs (as a progress check) are also scheduled (dates to be confirmed) during 2016 for Sierra Leone; Guinea Bissau and Cote d'Ivoire.

From the start of the project in December 2014 to the end of March 2016, a total of 17 AVs have been undertaken in Africa: to Benin, Burkina Faso, Equatorial Guinea, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea Bissau, Ivory Coast, Liberia, Mali, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Togo, Gambia, Mauritania, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Cameroon and Niger.

Delays or Deviations (*if any, briefly describe the delays or changes in focus, approach or targets, and provide a short justification for the change (1-2 paragraphs)*)

A total of 16 Assistance Visits (AVs) were planned to be completed during the second and third quarters of 2015 and by the end of September 10 had been undertaken. An additional two AVs planned for the third quarter (Cameroon and Niger) were completed in October. Planned AVs not undertaken in 2015 are being arranged for 2016.

Two training events planned for the last two quarters of 2015 were postponed to 2016. One has been held in the Middle East region during 29 February-3 March 2016 and the other, in Europe, is scheduled for October 2016.
