NARRATIVE

Background and Rationale for this proposal:

Following the appointment of Josette Sheeran as Special Envoy for Haiti in June of 2017, the Office of the Special Envoy, in close coordination with the Secretary-General and Deputy Secretary-General, is working to achieve concrete time bound outcomes. The SE has formulated the following work plan based on her mandated programme of work.

OVERALL GOAL: Reposition the strategy/approach/execution regarding Haiti cholera along the following areas:

- A. Support the development of an UN system wide coherent response to cholera in Haiti:
- B. Review and develop credible fundraising strategy and raise funds to support Haiti and key stakeholders in ending the transmission of cholera;
- C. Develop successful fundraising and execution strategy for "Track 2" providing material support to the communities most affected by cholera;
- D. Develop "lessons learned" proposals for the UN system to ensure effective management of such situations in the future;
- E. Help develop and execute an effective outreach and communications strategy to reach all key stakeholders and the communications hardest hit by cholera;
- F. Develop and map a work plan for the above.

Coherence and coordination with key UN agencies on the following objectives of the WORK PLAN:

- A. Support the development of an integrated system-wide response plan in Haiti
 - a. This plan seeks to bring coherence to all existing mechanisms, including the UNDAF, the HRP, and the National Plan;
 - b. Integrated plan should be based on the Haitian government plan and have the input and buy-in of key UN stakeholders (Mission, Agencies, Funds, and Programs) and be communicated clearly with other key stakeholders;
 - c. All the above should support the UNCT in Haiti, which is the key development and executing entity of the above.
- B. Review and develop credible fundraising strategy and raise funds to support Haiti and key stakeholders in ending the transmission of cholera. This includes a mapping exercise to outline all investments thus far from UN and bilateral donors since the outbreak of cholera.
 - a. <u>Track 1a:</u> Identify total aggregate funding spent towards coordination, treatment and prevention of the transmission of cholera (including surveillance, rapid response, health assistance and vaccinations). Funding should be broken down by both donor (who has given what), as well as by implementation (what has been spent, and who implemented). Both funding and implementation should be system-wide, including the IADB, World Bank and bilateral donors;
 - b. <u>Track 1b:</u> Same activity as above, focused on operations to improve access to water and sanitation and health care to address the root causes of the epidemic;
 - c. <u>Resource Mobilization:</u> Secure significant programmatic funding to the New Approach to Cholera. Both through new earmarked contributions as well through the voluntary reallocation by Member States of their unencumbered balances intended for MINUSTAH, which total upwards of 40 million;
 - d. <u>Funding gap analysis priority determination</u>: Conduct an inclusive process to determine key gaps, and which components of the cholera response need priority funding (including all tracks).
- C. Develop successful fundraising and execution strategy for "Track 2" providing material support to the communities most affected by cholera
 - a. Work with key stakeholders to develop a credible approach to consultations;
 - Work with key nations and other possible donors (private sector, Foundations, public) to raise funds for Track 2;
 - c. Develop possible execution options for Track 2.

- D. Develop with key agencies "lessons learned" proposals for the UN system to ensure effective management of such situations in the future
 - a. Review and develop proposals regarding Risk Management Protocols to ensure that there are clear procedures are activated in situations that could impact UN reputation;
 - b. Review and develop proposals to strengthen environmental impact policies and procedures in the UN
 - Review and develop proposals regarding policies and procedures that would be activated in situation where the UN is inadvertently involved in harm to individuals or communities (tainted food, bad medicines, accidents, etc) in support of executing agencies
 - d. Review and consider other possible 'lessons learned" for development
 - e. Review and develop options for the above from "best practices" internal and external to UN in each area
- E. Help develop and execute an effective outreach and communications strategy to reach all key stakeholders and the communities hardest hit by cholera
 - a. Work with key NGO and other stakeholders at the national and global level
 - b. Review current UN messaging on Haiti and cholera at the national and global level
 - c. Position to reflect a "doable" approach with lessons learned
 - d. Develop an execution strategy
- F. Develop and map a work plan for the above
 - a. Develop time frames and deliverables
 - b. Develop outputs and outcomes

Support requirements

In working towards these goals, the Office of the Special Envoy needs to urgently raise funds to bolster its operational and technical capacity. This includes through the hiring of dedicated staff, the engagement of high-caliber technical consultants and securing operational support (travel and office support) to execute toward these goals. The current mandate of the SE runs for 1 year from July 1, 2017 to July 1, 2018 and funding support is sought for this time frame.

Budgetary support is urgently required to support the launching and sustaining of these operations. Currently, the OSE is funded with seed funding from the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean. Funding is limited to 1 official visit to Haiti by the Special Envoy and the hiring of 1 team assistant for a 4-month period. All funds will expire on 31 March 2018.

a) Capacity of RUNO(s) and implementing partners: In order to contribute to the UN Haiti Cholera Response MPTF, The Special Envoy is working in close coordination with the Secretary-General and the Deputy Secretary-General, who offer support as required and requested by the Special Envoy. The Office of the Special Envoy for Haiti is being supported substantively by the Executive Office of the Secretary General and administratively by the Executive Office of the Department of Peacekeeping Operations. Both support entities have vast experience and expertise in supporting the functions of a Special Envoy.
