Catchment Population:

The total population of the four regions (Bari, Nugal, Sanaag and Awdal) is 2,329,596. This figure is based on the Somalia Population Estimation Survey dated in 2015 issued by UNFPA and Federal Government of Somalia.

Link with allocation strategy :

The target areas were severely affected by prolonged drought and in urgent need of NFI items. This allocated was intended to provide NFI/shelter support to IDPs, pastrolists and host community affected by the drought. The proposal is therefore in line with allocation strategy. The project addresses objective 2 of the allocation strategy which is "lifesaving and life sustaining integrated response to IDPs and host communities. The clusters prioritized are food security, health, nutrition and WASH with complementary services by the education, shelter and protection clusters.

BACKGROUND

Organiza

1. Humanitarian context analysis

Severe drought exacerbated by El Niño conditions has hit parts of Puntland and Somaliland, affecting hundreds of thousands of people. The drought compounds an already challenging humanitarian situation in the area and has brought the estimated number of people who face acute food security Crisis and Emergency in Somaliland and Puntland to 385,000.

The drought conditions follow two successive seasons with erratic rainfall, the situation is expected to worsen in the coming months due to depletion of water resources and pasture. According to SWALIM, there is an increased likelihood of near-normal to below normal Gu rains in Somaliland and northern parts of Puntland. This is expected to further negatively impact on the drought situation.

The depletion of water resources and pasture have triggered livestock migration and increased competition for scarce resources among pastoralists, which results in tensions. This situation has triggered livestock from central Puntland to move westward to areas that received better rains, putting additional strain on resources that will likely soon be exhausted. The most vulnerable pastoralists stayed behind, unable to afford the high cost of transport to reach areas with better conditions. There is an urgent need to provide life saving humanitarian assistance to affected population to prevent rapid deterioration of the situation.

2. Needs assessment

The depletion of water resources and pasture have triggered livestock migration and increased competition for scarce resources among pastoralists, which results in tensions. This situation has triggered livestock from central Puntland to move westward to areas that received better rains, putting additional strain on resources that will likely soon be exhausted. The most vulnerable pastoralists stayed behind, unable to afford the high cost of transport to reach areas with better conditions. There is an urgent need to provide lifesaving humanitarian assistance to affected population to prevent rapid deterioration of the situation.

In Puntland and Somaliland, most drought-affected families live collectively with host families. Families who cannot afford to migrate due to the high cost of transportation have built spontaneous and unplanned settlements next to their relatives and they require NFI kits. An estimated 60,000 people are in need of non-food items (NFIs) and shelter. The main challenge that poor host families and displaced households face is inadequate shelter. Shelters are partially destroyed, making them susceptible to wind, heat and cold. Most displaced people do not have blankets, plastic sheets, bed mats and jerry cans. The existing IDPs in Bossaso, Qardho, Garowe and urban centres in Sanaag region often live in over-crowded settlements and basic services are already overstretched. Further displacement would be detrimental for the existing settlements.

3. Description Of Beneficiaries

The target estimated beneficiaries of this project is 5,000 household with 30,000 individuals. IDPs and pastoralists are the target group of the intervention. The target beneficiaries will be selected based on set vulnerability criteria. Pastoralist who lost their animals and moved to near towns and villages will be given priority. Newly reported IDPs on the main towns and villages will be prioritized. For IDPs, the shelter conditions will be assessed and those with poor shelter conditions will be consider for inclusion.

4. Grant Request Justification

The grant is requested to respond the drought and arrange NFI distribution to the drought affected communities in Bari, Nugaal and Sanaag regions. UNHCR has small NFI stock which in the meanitme will be used to response the drought immediately.

5. Complementarity

This project will complement with other intervention in the target areas like water and food. Distribution of items such as Jerry cans and cooking utensils which is part of the standard NFI kit will be help full for the affected populations. This project will complement the ongoing efforts to provide immediate assistance such as water, nutrition and food.

LOGICAL FRAMEWORK

Overall project objective

To protect draught affected and displaced population from exposure to extreme life threatening conditions like wind, heat and cold. Based on a thorough needs assessment, NFI kits will be distributed to the most vulnerable households.

Monitoring & Reporting plan

UNHCR and its partners will monitor the implementation of the project. the target areas are accessible and UNHCR will undertake regular monitoring mission in the field. Local authorities in the target areas will be engaged in the process to ensure proper coordination of activities with authority. Four weeks after the distribution, Post Distribution Monitoring (PDM) will be carried out to ensure that the assistance reached intended beneficiaries. UNHCR will provide quarterly report to donor and adhoc reports as and when required.

Accountability to Affected Populations

The distrubtion of NFIs will follow UNHCR standard operating procedures of NFIs distribution. All beneficiaries will sign the list of distribution. The implementing partner will share UNHCR the list of distribution, report along with photos. UNHCR will arrange post distribution monitoring after the distribution.

Implementation Plan

Based on joint assessment report conducted by shelter/NFI cluster, UNHCR and it's implementing partners will distribute 5,000 NFI kits to 5,000 draught affected households in parts of Puntland and Somaliland.

The composition of the kit for each family includes 1 reinforced plastic tarpaulin, 3 blankets, 2 sleeping mats, 1 kitchen set, 2 collapsible 10litre jerricans and 750 grams of soap. Distribution will take place depending on the situation of affected population either at their point of habitual residence or at neutral location where logistics/security allows. CHF funds under this application will be used to cover procurement, transportation and distribution of NFI kits. These activities will be implemented in partnership with UNHCR strategic partners, targeting most vulnerable households.

Gender analysis is included in assessment prior to NFI distribution and the result will be reflected on activities to include more than 60% of female beneficiaries. As part of UNHCR NFI distribution strategy, priority is given to women headed households, older persons supporting children and persons with disability. Collected data during registration of beneficiaries is segregated by gender and age to ensure effective follow up. Likewise, PDM information will be gender disaggregated and will inform UNHCR on usability and acceptance of the kits.
