BACKGROUND										
1. Humanitarian context analysis										

Somalia remains in a state of chronic catastrophe, characterized by a complex political environment, extreme poverty, food insecurity. conflict and instability. All health indicators in Somalia remain critically IOW. Somalia one of the top ten countries with highest prevalence of malnutrition in the world and the third highest in the eastern and southern Africa region at 13.6 percent GAM rate amongst children under five years with 2.3 percent being severely malnourished. Based on prevalence results from 39 nutrition surveys conducted from May to July 2015 by FSNAU and partners, an estimated 307,750 children under the age of five are acutely malnourished. According to FSNAU/FEWS NET Technical Release of 31st. August 2015, there is widespread acute malnutrition across Somalia and large numbers of people will be acutely food insecure through to December 2015. This situation is likely to be exacerbated by heavier than normal expected rains and possible flooding in the Deyr 2015 rainy season due to El Niño that will bring much heavier rain than normal. This would have a negative impact on the food security of the riverine communities and thus worsening the health and nutritional status of the affected vulnerable communities. Mogadishu IDPs as the trend of IDP influx increasing, GAM rate of 12.3 percent and SAM rate of 3.5 percent indicating a Serious nutrition situation which is an improvement when compared to GAM (Global acute malnutrition)rate of 18.8 percent and SAM(Severe acute malnutrition) rate of 1.6 percent recorded in Gu 2014 and GAM rate of 8.0 percent noted in Deyr 2013/14. Increased in SAM levels were also noted though prevalence is still sustained as Serious levels since Deyr 2013. The crude <5 death rates reported are 1.35/10 000/day and 3.35/10 000/day respectively in the Mogadishu IDPs, indicating an emergency situation according to WHO classification, and a substantial deterioration from the previously reported crude and under five mortality rates of 0.6/10 000/day, and 0.5/10 000/day respectively. High morbidity rates of 43.1 percent in Mogadishu IDPs, meaning nearly 1 in every 2 children assessed had fallen ill 2 prior to the survey. The primary Nutrition service gaps remain very significant for this population, which SOYDA intends to address. This project aims to tackle some of the problems mentioned above in order to contribute towards the cluster strategic objective to ensure equal and integrated life-saving assistance to malnourished children and people living in humanitarian emergency and crisis to reduce mortality and destitution. It particularly supports the vulnerable communities of IDP boys and girls under 5 and pregnant and lactating women. Special focus will be given to different boys' and girls' nutrition needs as well as nutritional support needs of pregnant women and lactating mothers to continue breastfeeding. The project will target for direct beneficiaries on 1200 boys, 1200 girls and 1000 PLW for 2 Outreach (Bondhere District IDPs, Garasbaley IDPs) and 1 Static (Km13) Outpatient Therapeutic Propgram(OTP, in Mogadishu IDPs, also the project will improve the capacity of the 26 Male and 38 Female staff through giving enhanced IMAM training. As there are many IDP female-headed households, women can be especially vulnerable to malnutrition. SOYDA will work closely with WASH, Health and food security clusters, and also will integrate Nutrition with Health and WASH projects to ensure underlying causes of malnutrition are addressed. SOYDA will assure Coordination with other partners at all levels as well as referral mechanisms. SOYDA will ensure equal numbers of boys and girls are assessed and capacities of the women improved to empower the women and involve them in decision-making and thus the community will be involved in the project implementation from planning, through implementation to project evaluation. SOYDA will participate in the entire nutrition cluster meeting all levels.

2. Needs assessment

Access to quality Life-saving Nutrition services become increasingly difficult in Mogadishu IDPs/Host Communities and population has very little capacity to address their health & Nutrition care needs. Inadequate access to safe water and proper sanitation, high risk of AWD outbreak, increasingly eroded livelihoods, and mass displacement in Mogadishu IDPs/Host Communities can increase the risk of Malnutrition, communicable disease outbreaks, including cholera and measles. The GAM rate is above the emergency threshold and the SAM rates are also very high. Since 2010, SOYDA has been addressing the Nutrition crises by operationalizing and working In IDPs in Mogadishu 3 integrated OTPs/TSFPs (targeted supplementary feeding program) support from UNOCHA through CHF funds with a total target of 3400 Beneficiaries of 1200 boys, 1200 girls, and 1000 PLW (pregnant lactating women)and 64 of both male and female Staff will be built their capacity during project period. SOYDA will contribute a better service by considering the community need and ovoid sudden gap and have ensured better access to Nutrition care and currently prepares to scale up Nutrition service in Mogadishu IDPs for better Nutrition Service access. The project area is where the currently influx has been observed, in additional to the route of the people from the villages who are seeking humanitarian assistance and flew from their homeland due to security,fighting. SOYDA receives RUTF (ready to use food)Supply from UNICEF. SOYDA will assure Coordination with other partners at all levels as well as referral mechanisms to ovoid duplication.

Since 2010, The CHF Somalia supported SOYDA with 2 Nutrition projects in Mogadishu, currently we are planning to implement 2 Outreach and 1 Static integrated OTP and TSFP in Mogadishu IDPs particularly Km13, Garasbaley and Bondhere District IDPs. Our integrated programme approach will offer activities in line with other nutrition interventions (micro nutrient, De Worming & IYCF programmes) Infant Young Feeding Programme)to prevent further deterioration of the nutrition situation in the area. We have an established link with local authorities, and partners with Mogadishu who are part of the advocacy and sustainability framework to educate and mobilize community members on key Health, Nutrition and hygiene issues by using both male and female workers. We shall build on the aforementioned interventions in Mogadishu IDPs to provide a holistic response to the emergency affecting drought and conflict affected populations.SOYDA has the capacity to execute the project, and has staff of who have verse experience in different level and have multi-desplinanry on both health and nutrition. The staffs had been intensively trained by SOYDA as well for the entire organization projects.
