## **Brief Description**

The REFS-ProDoc with 27-month timeline entailing the total budget of \$10,911,342, was signed up by UNDP on 27 Dec 2018 and MOIFAR on 03 Jan 2019. The project has achieved a number of key milestones in 2019 and during the first two quarters of 2020, however, the project remained under-resourced with funding gap of \$3.7 million to implement remaining activities.

In view of existing funding gap REFS presented three scenarios on budget/activity prioritization: Scenario A — mandatory activities to be covered in the period of July-December 2020, with available resources amounting to be \$1,955,479; Scenario B — additional activities to be covered in the period of July-December 2020 with corresponding funding gap of \$1,008,311; and Scenario C — remaining activities to be covered in the period of Jan-December 2021 with funding gap of \$2,688,768.

Given the financial resources at hand it was decided that Scenario A with available resources (\$1,955,479) would be implemented in 2020, while scenario B and C would be merged with aggregated financial implications to the tune of \$3,697,079; and a subsequent framework of implementation would be developed for 2021. This required No-

Cost-Extension for nine months i.e. April-December 2021 allowing to carry forward the remaining activities and mobilizing required resources to support thereof.

Additionally, in view of COVID 19, political impasse on electoral model and ongoing negotiations between FGS and FMSes on allocation of power, the REFS project implementation framework has been revised responding to the transient dynamics of reconciliation and federalisation in Somalia. The funding gap faced by the project necessitated budget reprioritisation with mandatory activities to be undertaken by 31st December 2020 and remaining activities to be implemented by 31st December 2021,

Against this backdrop, a mid-year Project Board Meeting was convened on 21 July 2020 and the Board reviewed the REFS Project progress (January-June 2020), discussed the Revised Project Implementation Strategy giving policy directions on AWP (addressing funding gap) and agreed in principle on the no-cost extension of REFS Project until 31st December 2021. In follow up of the Project Board meeting, a consultation with donors was held on 29th July 2020 wherein MPTF donors (Germany, Sweden and Switzerland) supporting REFS approved the no cost project extension until 31 Dec 2021.
