Brief Description

Constitutional Review Support Project (CRSP) was designed to provide responsive support to the key players in the constitutional review process, particularly Ministry of Constitutional Affairs (MoCA), Independent Constitution Review and Implementation Commission (ICRIC), Parliamentary Oversight Committee and Ministries of Constitutional Affairs of FMSs. CRSP has been supporting the MoCA, ICRIC and Oversight Committee in their efforts to plan and work jointly to bring together stakeholders across and at all levels of government and the community to build consensus around a range of outstanding constitutional issues. It is expected to produce an effective, transparent and accountable constitutional review process through strengthening inclusive political processes at all levels to develop a new social contract that meets the needs of Somali women and men, reflects political realities and is of good technical quality in order to foster equitable and sustainable development and peace. During designing phase of the project in 2017, it was envisaged to complete the constitution review process by Dec 2019 so CRSP was designed for a two year period implementation from Jan 2018 to Dec 2019.

Due to delay in completion of the constitution review process pending settlement of political agreements, negotiations, consultations and the adoption of the constitution, timeline for completion of constitution reivew process was extended until 30 Jun 2020 and agreed through 2020 mutual accountability framework (MAF) for Somalia by all the stakeholders on 02 October 2019. Accordingly, CRSP worked with MOCA and prepared the work plan for cost extension of the project unitl 30 Jun 2020 for continuation of support. The workplan with budget of USD 4,195,172 for 6 months from Jan- Jun 2020 was discussed in the project board meeting held on 20 Nov 2019 and approved. The cost extension of CRSP was granted with a budget increase of USD 1,760,871. With this approval, of cost extension, the total project budget is increased from USD 10,937,534 to USD 12,698,405 for a period from Jan 2018 to Jun 2020. The 2019 budget was also revised to accommodate changes in amounts allocated within outputs.
