In this context, youth and women's participation in governance and decision-making remain vital for progressing the peacebuilding and development agenda. The project, working closely with key Government stakeholders, youth, women leaders and political parties, will empower women and youth with a greater understanding of peacebuilding issues, and will catalyze their participation and engagement in governance and decisionmaking processes, and responses related to sustaining peace. To achieve this, the project uses innovative approaches such as (1) a youth-centric approach which ensures that young people are both beneficiaries and equal partners, and (2) multi-party dialogues to achieve consensus across political parties on governance and peacebuilding issues at the local level.
